

NOTE TO FILE

On January 26th, 2010, three days before the general closing date of the public record, Deze submitted a proposed alternate transmission line route along Fairchild Point in the East Arm of Great Slave Lake. To allow fair opportunity for people in the vicinity of this route to comment, the Review Board is keeping the public record open for submissions regarding this part of the route until February 18th, 2010.

To ensure that people with interests in the area are aware of this, the Board directed staff to provide newspaper and radio notice. The Board also directed staff to attempt to directly inform people with interests in the area.

On February 1st, 2010, I contacted Wallace Finalyson, owner of Trophy Lodge on Fairchild Point, by telephone in Victoria, BC. I summarized the proposed route and the current stage of the EA process, and identified relevant materials on the Review Board website. Mr. Finalyson provided me with the telephone number for Mr. Roger Catling, who's home is located on Fairchild Point.

Mr. Finlayson also identified other potentially interested people. These are Dave and Kristen Olesen, who live at the Hoarfrost River on McLeod Bay, and Richard Black and Lance Loubert, who have a cabin in Charlton Bay. I have contacted Mr. Catling by phone and the Olesens by e-mail. Mr. Catling indicated that Mr. Black and Mr. Leubert have moved to Wisconsin and California several years ago.

I sent e-mails to both Mr. Catling and Mr. Finalyson with further details about the current stage of this environmental assessment and references to documents on the public registry. I encouraged them to contact me if they have further questions.

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
