Mark, the attached is a screen shot showing the proposed all season road. I've added the IAB Land boundaries approximately. I've also shown an area of marshy ground which the road needs to avoid. The road currently follows the old logging road, except where it cuts across to the river crossing location. We made this change recently to avoid the river bank at the corner which is eroding. However, I think it also does a pretty good job of 'running down the centre' given the marshy ground limitation. We can fine tune the alignment during the detailed design phase.
