Subject: Details and clarification of Heritage Canada's position with respect to

expansion of the existing Nahanni National Park Reserve (NNPR).

Objective: To assist the Review Board in fully understanding the position of

Heritage Canada on the various proposals for expansion of the NNPR; and, to provide a sense of the "likelihood" of any one of these expansion

proposals becoming a reality.

Preamble: The 1987 NNPR Management Plan identified three areas of possible

future expansion to the existing Park Reserve. With the start of land claim negotiations in the Deh Cho Region, the Deh Cho First Nations and Naha Deho First Nation of Nahanni Butte have identified the South Nahanni River watershed as the preferred area of future NNPR expansion. The proposed seismic operation does not impinge upon any of the three areas identified in the management plan, but does impinge

upon part of the watershed.

Request: Please provide:

(a) Details and clarification of Heritage Canada's position on the possible expansion of the NNPR; and

(b) An indication of the likelihood of any of these expansion proposals becoming a reality, and what the implications to past and current activities immediately outside the NNPR would be.

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Subject: Ecological integrity

Objective: To provide the Review Board a greater understanding of the linkages

and role that "buffer zones" surrounding a park have in maintaining

ecological integrity within the park.

Preamble: First Nations in the Deh Cho Region, and others, have raised concerns

that developments occurring in the South Nahanni River watershed could affect the ecological integrity of the existing NNPR or of a potentially larger protected area. NNPR also identified an increase in

non-aboriginal hunting in the area to be a concern.

Request: Please provide:

(a) Information on the role that "buffer zones" surrounding NNPR or a potentially larger protected area have in maintaining the ecological integrity of the existing NNPR or larger protected area.

- (b) Indicate the size and extent of the buffer zone necessary to protect NNPR and maintain ecological integrity. Please provide a map with accurate representation and coordinates of the NNPR buffer zone and proposed expansion areas with resulting buffer zones.
- (c) Provide details with supporting evidence and rationale on NNPR concern with an increase in non-aboriginal hunting pressure resulting from this development going ahead, and the effects of this on ecological integrity.
