Re: Snap Lake Diamond Project Site Visit

De Beers Canada Mining Inc extends an invitation to the Yellowknife Dene First Nation-Lands & Environment Committee to visit the Snap Lake Diamond Project during the week of June 16th, 2003. To meet the expressed interest of the Yellowknife Dene, the purpose of the trip is to visit the esker quarry south of the Snap Lake project site and review the area being used, discuss reclamation and review its location relative to historical resources and wildlife habitat.
