

Re: Closing Date of Public Registry - De Beers Snap Lake Diamond Project

The Mackenzie Valley Environmental Impact Review Board (Review Board) is writing in response to your request at the recent Snap Lake public hearing "...that the Board consider making an amendment to the scheduled closure date for the public registry, as to allow for the filing of the socio-economic agreement, and the environmental agreements, prior to the issuance of your report on this environmental assessment."

At the hearing, Canadian Arctic Resources Committee, the North Slave Métis Alliance, and Lutsel K'e Dene First Nation suggested that it was essential for the Board to know the provisions of the socio-economic agreement (SEA), and environmental agreements prior to the Board completing its Report of Environmental Assessment. Other Parties supported completion of these agreements prior to the startup of the regulatory stage or prior to construction, but felt it was not necessary to have them completed prior to the completion of the Report of Environmental Assessment (EA). The GNWT indicated at the hearing that they would prefer if a SEA was in place by June 30th, 2003.

Any expectation of receiving these agreements prior to the close of the public registry presupposes that the negotiations will be completed. There were no specific undertakings made at the public hearing by the parties to the negotiations to try to meet any specific deadline and the Board has not been informed of any changes of the parties' intentions since the close of the Snap Lake Diamond Project hearings.

In considering this matter, the Review Board decided that the closing date of the public registry would not be extended.
