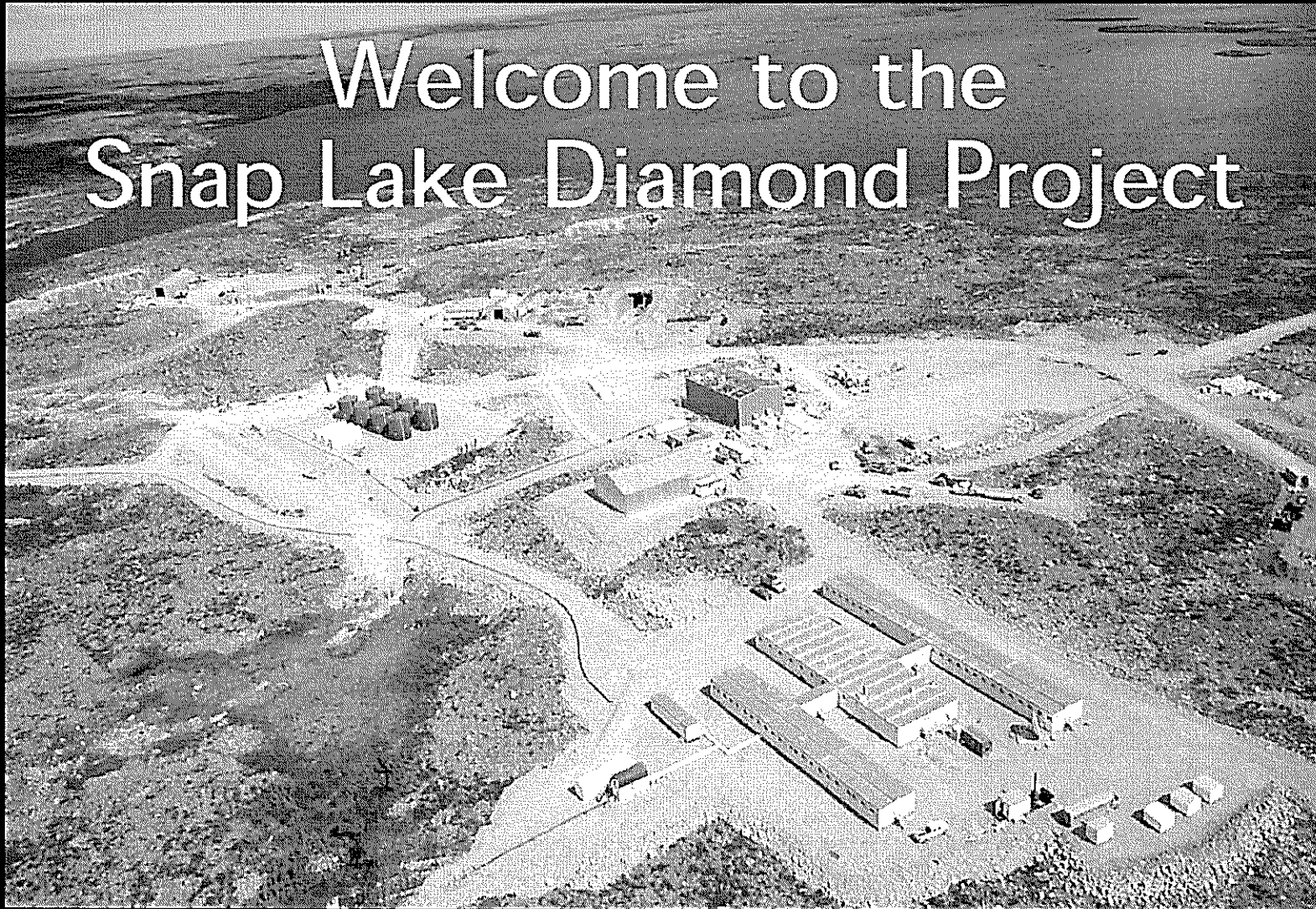

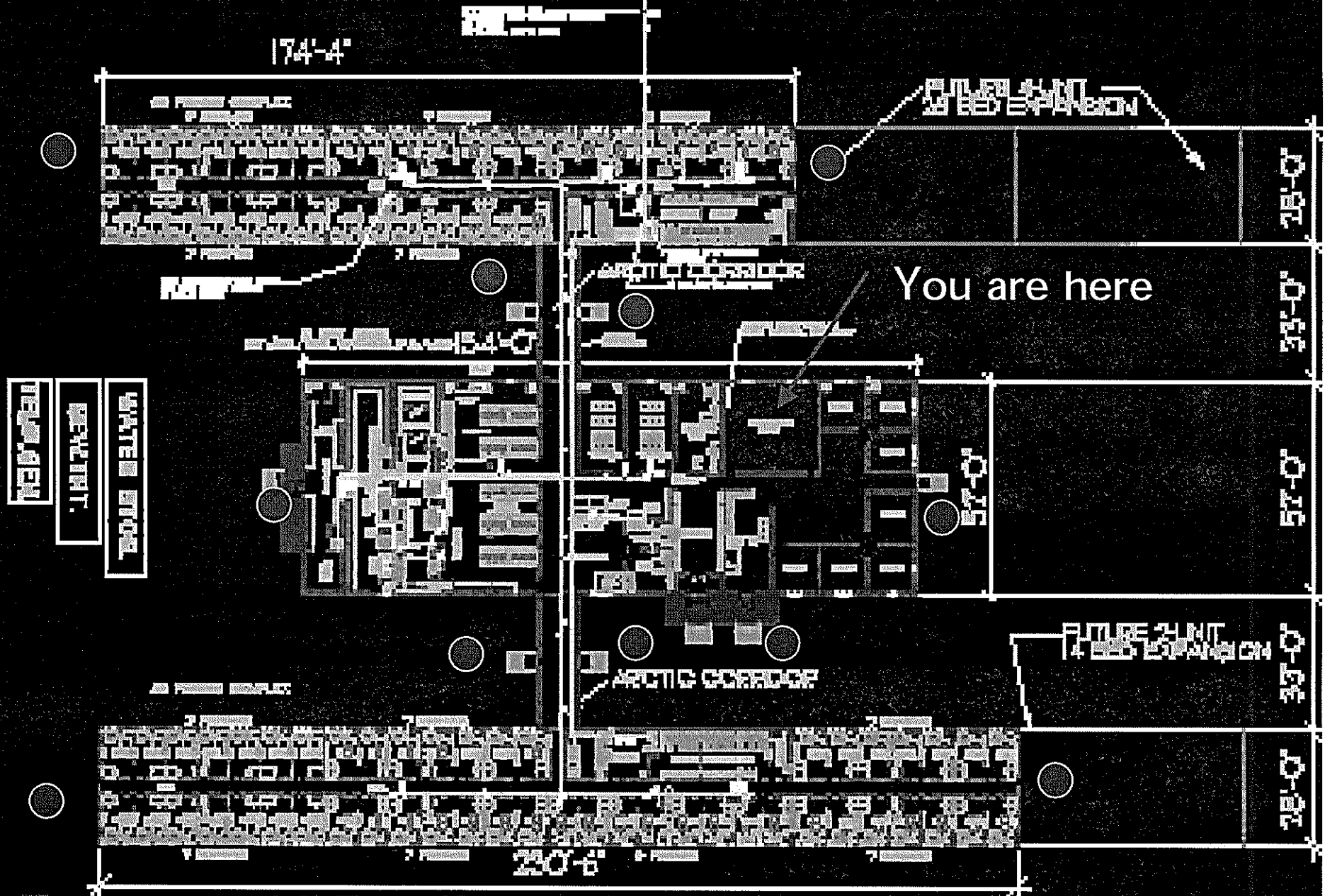

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Fires On Surface

- ◆ When leaving buildings do not take unnecessary risks
- ◆ Do not pass through smoke
- ◆ Feel all doors before you open them – if they are hot use another route
- ◆ If no other route is available, return to the closest safe place and close the door
- ◆ Where available - go to the window and open it to get fresh air and exit or call for help

Fires On Surface

- ◆ The evacuation procedure for all areas requires you to leave that building and report to a designated meeting (muster) area where a roll call will be done
- ◆ Fires in areas other than the camp complex - muster area is the camp dining room
- ◆ Fires in the camp complex - muster area is the 20' Trailer beside the cold storage building (Nuna office trailer)

Fire & Evacuation Procedure for the Camp

- ◆ In the case of fire or sounding of the fire alarm the following procedures are to be followed:
- ◆ If fire is detected immediately activate one of the fire pull alarm stations located throughout the complex
- ◆ REMEMBER – Do not put yourself at risk to fight a fire

Fire & Evacuation Procedure for the Camp

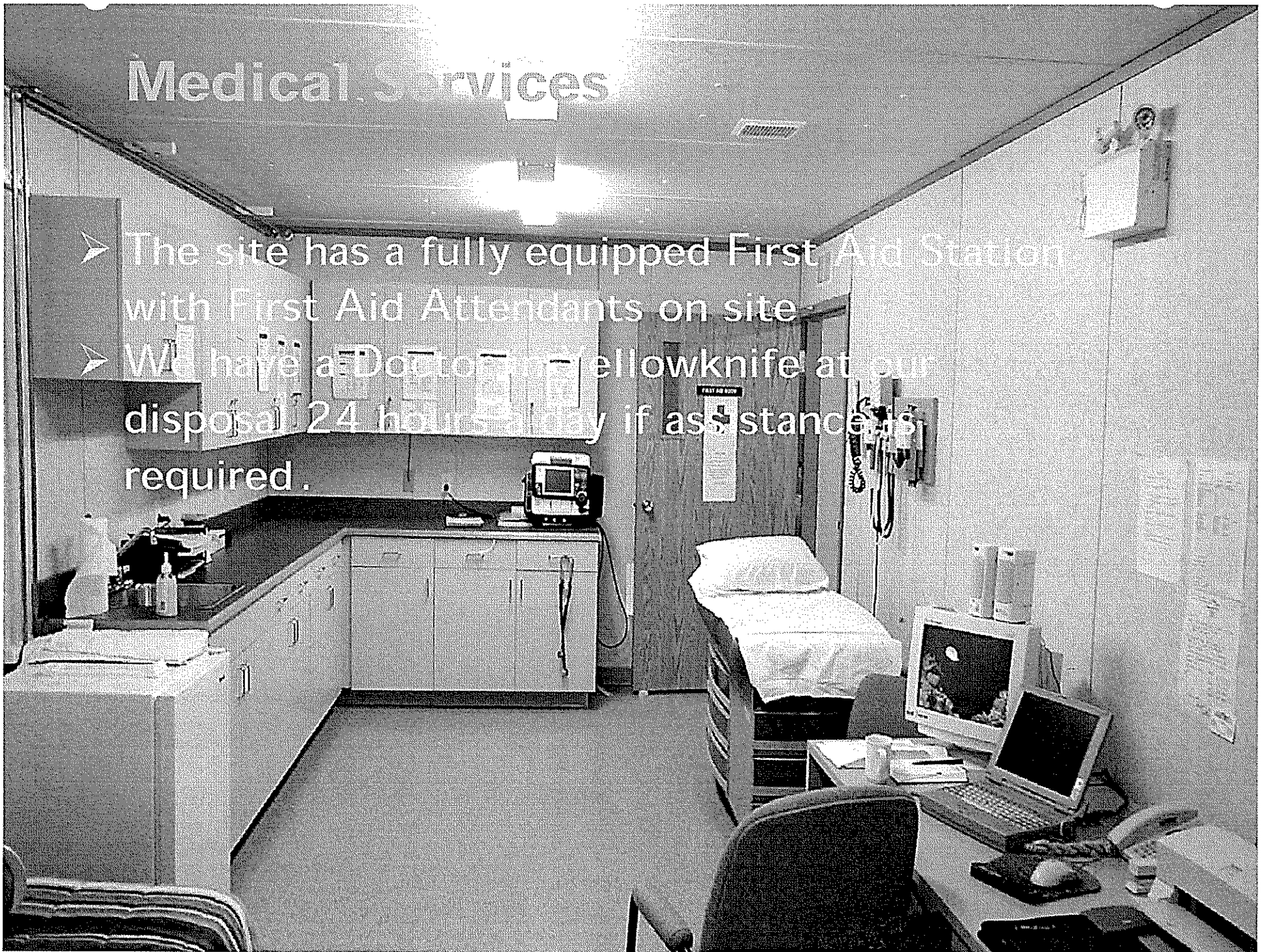
- ◆ Upon hearing the alarm immediately evacuate the complex via the closest available exit, closing (not locking) doors behind you as you proceed
- ◆ Report to the muster area for roll call and instructions
- ◆ Remain there until directed otherwise

Fire & Evacuation Procedure for the Camp

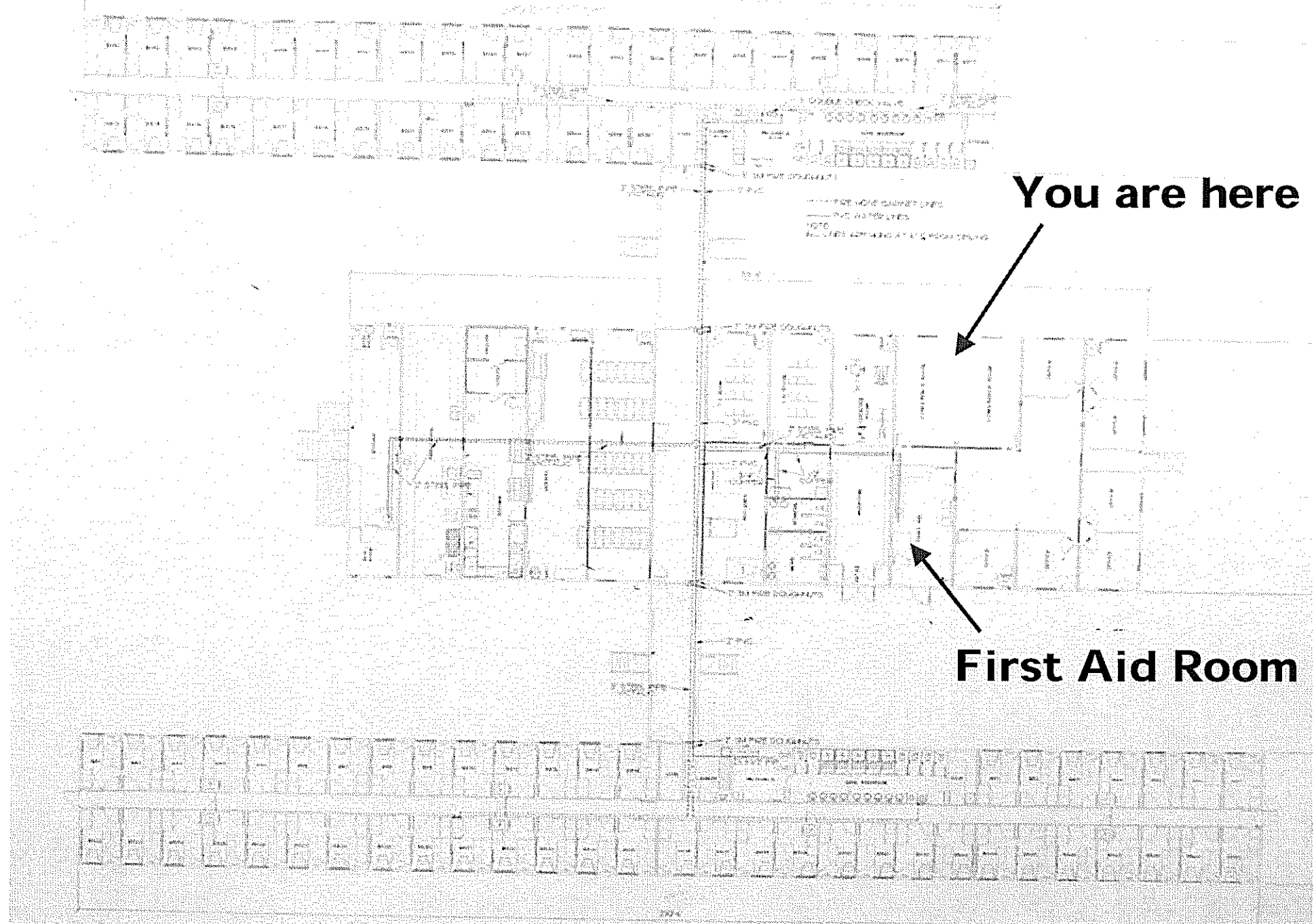
- ◆ Under no circumstances should you re-enter the complex until a Site Supervisor has given the all-clear message
- ◆ Report any concerns to a Site Supervisor

Medical Services

- The site has a fully equipped First Aid Station with First Aid Attendants on site.
- We have a Doctor in Yellowknife at our disposal 24 hours a day if assistance is required.

Smoking Policy

- ◆ The intent of our Smoking Policy is to protect personnel from the known health risks associated with smoking and from second hand smoke
- ◆ Smoking is **not permitted** in the following Snap Lake facilities:
 - Accommodations building
 - Kitchen and Cafeteria
 - Office areas

Smoking Not Permitted:

- Any "No smoking and No Open Flame" areas (i.e. fuel storage, fuel dispensing areas, explosives and cap magazines)
- While working with, around and transporting reagents, chemicals, explosives and fuels such as diesel, propane and gasoline

- Smoking is permitted in the "Smoking Allowed" television room

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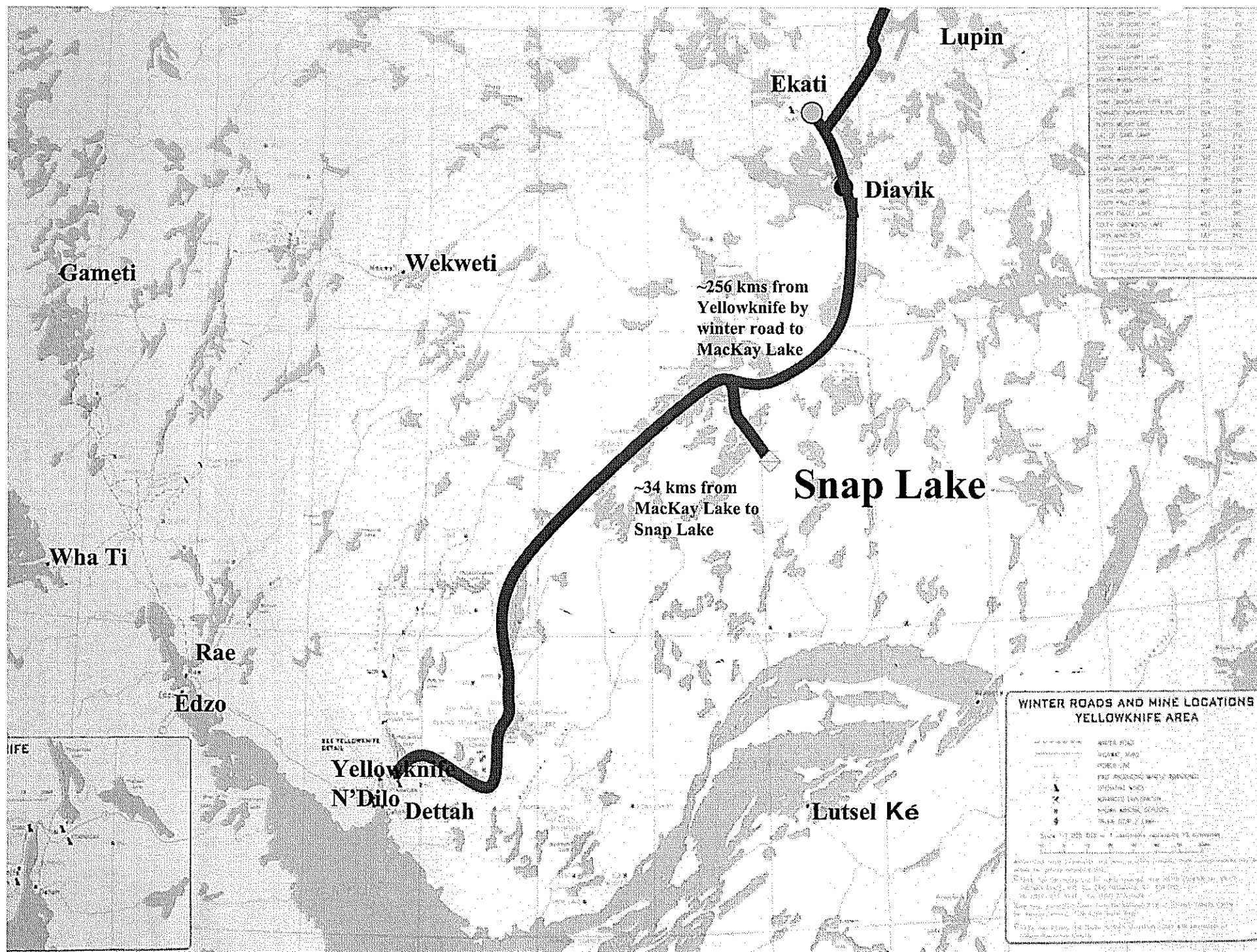

Project Description



North Pile

The North Pile will be a major feature of the Snap Lake Diamond Project. It will be built from waste rock and processed kimberlite (PK). The pile will be no higher than the surrounding hills and will cover an area of 92 hectares.

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De Beers and ISO 14001

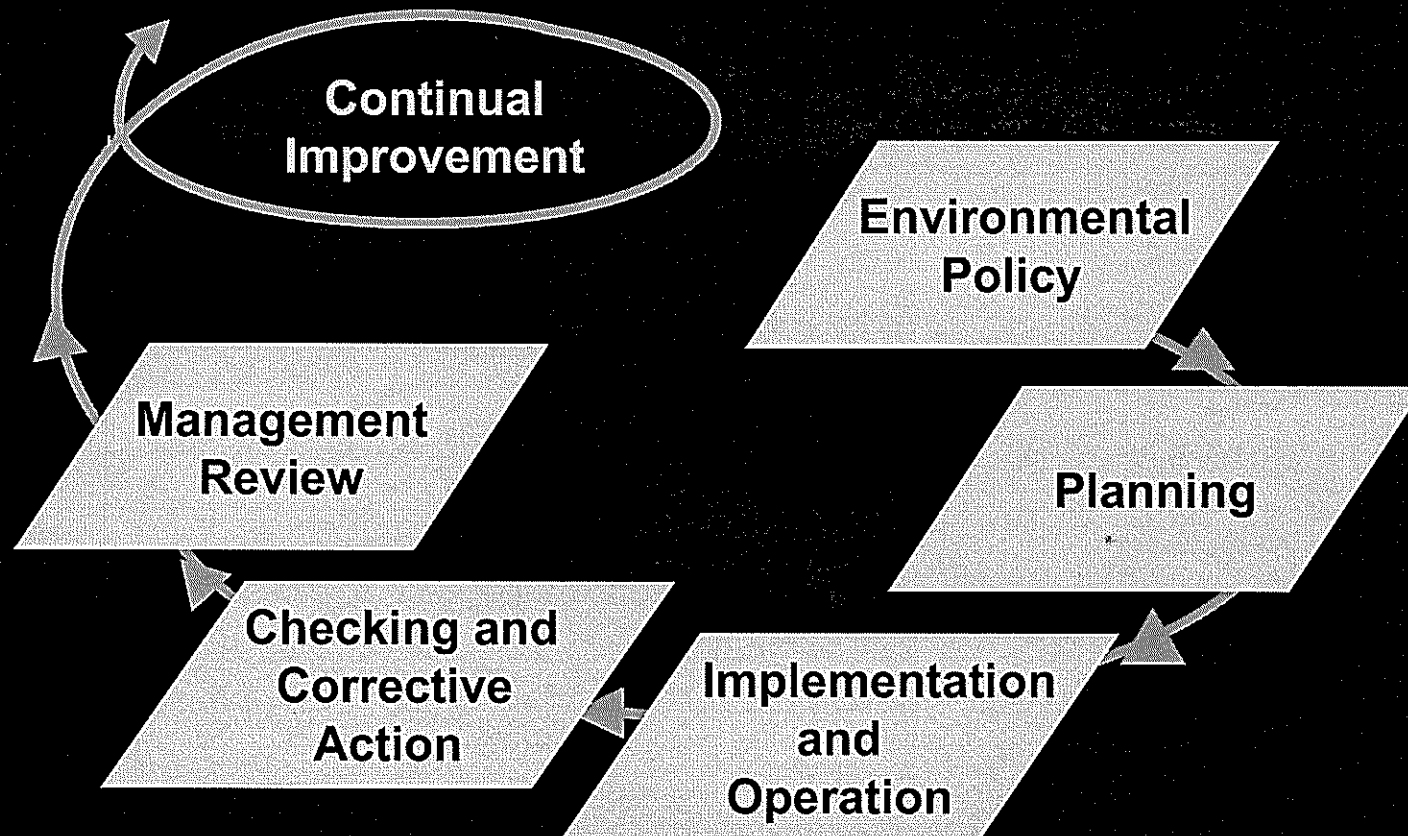
- ◆ De Beers is registering all of its worldwide operations to the International Standards Organization EMS standard ISO 14001
- ◆ De Beers Canada Exploration Inc. began registering operations in 2001 and continue to register new sites
- ◆ Snap Lake will be the first De Beers Canada Mining Inc. site to be registered - in December, 2002

 - product standards

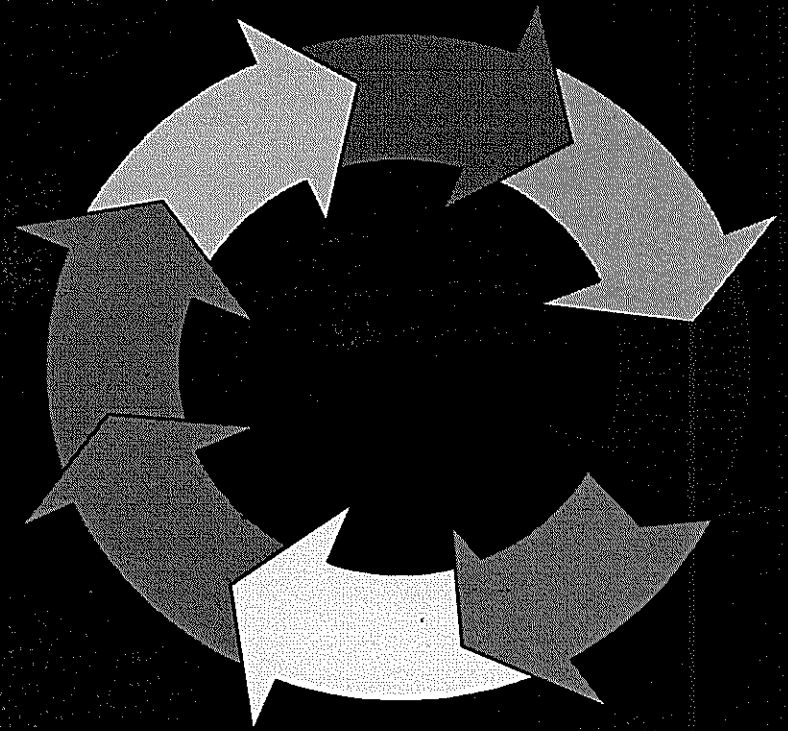

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Pollution Prevention

- ◆ "Process of enhancing the environmental management system to achieve improvements in overall environmental performance in line with the organization's environmental policy" (ISO 14001)

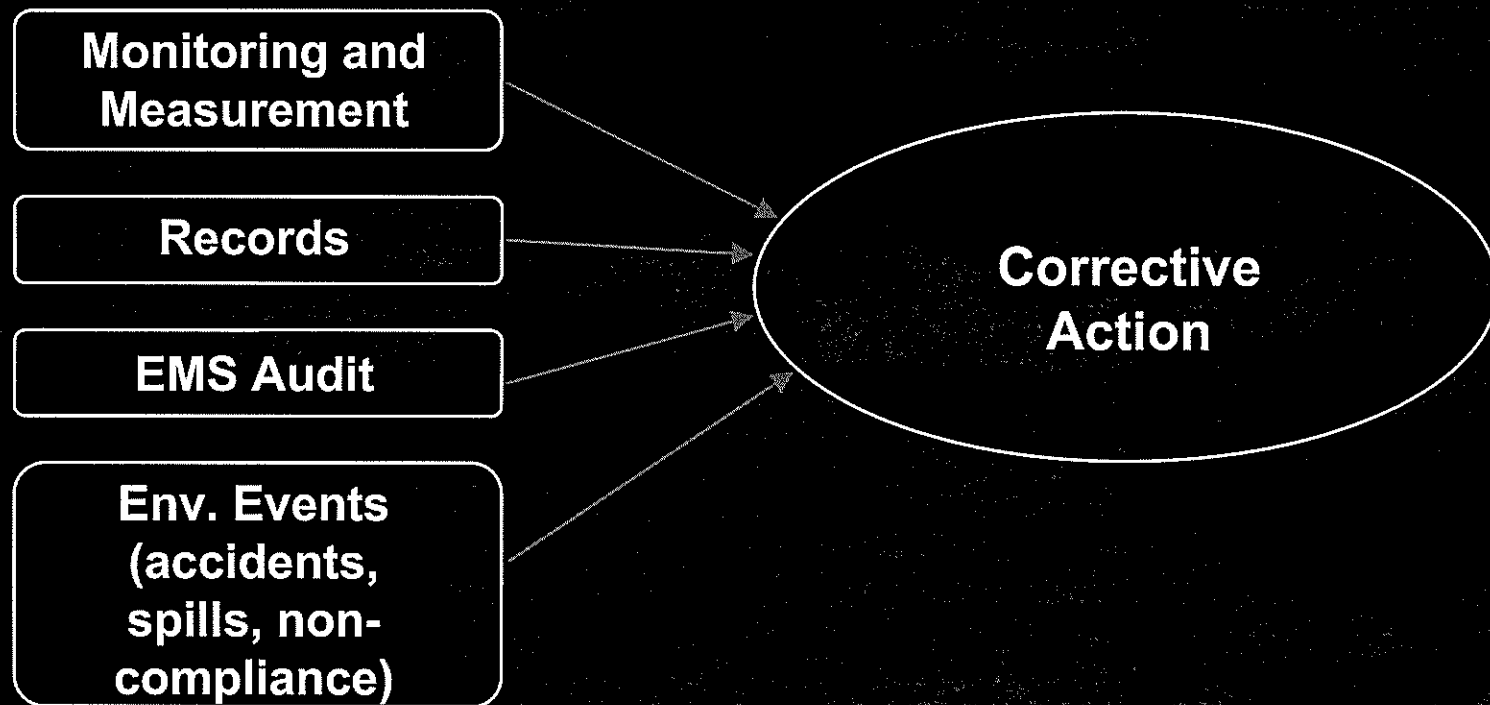

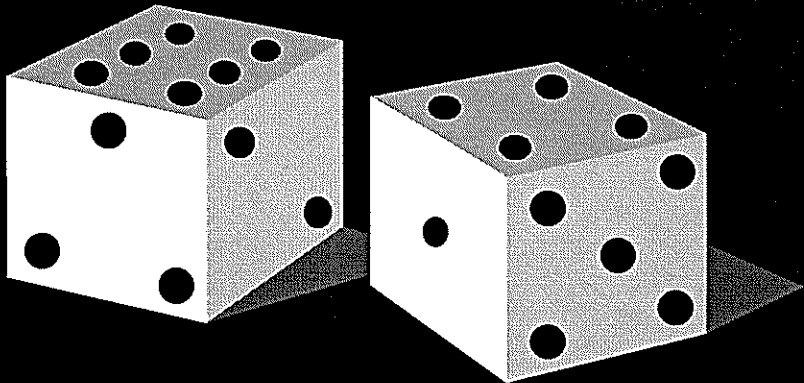

Setting Priorities Based on Risk

- ◆ Setting priorities to deal with risk is not a matter of rolling the dice ... the decisions have to be based on careful assessment and evaluation of business advantage



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Environmental Sensitivities

It is extremely important that we all realize the importance of taking care of the land, air and water

Everyone here is part of the site team and is expected to contribute to the stewardship of our environment



Environmental Sensitivities – Waste Management

- ◆ All waste materials, and material used to clean up spills, must be stored in the designated containers in the lined, waste storage areas for off-site recycling and disposal
- ◆ **Spill prevention is the rule; report all spills immediately for action**
- ◆ Transfer fuel and oil only in designated containment areas – don't try to "top-up" when fueling vehicles

Environmental Sensitivities - Garbage Control

- ◆ All garbage on site - especially foodstuffs must be disposed of so as not to attract wildlife
- ◆ This includes eating in designated areas, use of animal proof receptacles, monitoring and cleanup of remote sites and other strategies

It must be stressed that these preventive measures are the most effective in minimizing problems with local wildlife



Environmental Sensitivities - Wildlife

- ◆ Wildlife has the right-of-way and is not to be disturbed
- ◆ All food wastes must be temporarily stored in closed containers, and then incinerated



Site Rules Regarding Wildlife

- ◆ Feeding of wildlife is prohibited on site
- ◆ Harassing, or otherwise inflicting stress or injury to wildlife is prohibited
- ◆ No hunting or fishing of any type is permitted
- ◆ De Beers is committed to avoid adverse effects on the wildlife surrounding us
- ◆ ALL WILDLIFE IS TO BE TREATED WITH RESPECT
- ◆ Avoid contact wherever possible

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Health and Safety

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De Beers Canada Policy Statement Occupational Health and Safety

De Beers Canada* is committed to the health and safety of its employees. Protection of its employees from injury and providing the environment for the maintenance of good health are primary organisational objectives which will be promoted in all facets of the business. Every employee will be required to commit to this objective and to the target of eliminating all injuries in the workplace.

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De Beers Canada Policy Statement Occupational Health and Safety

De Beers Canada will achieve this through:

- Providing the necessary resources (equipment, people, training and money)
- Ensuring compliance with all legislation
- Developing appropriate health and safety programs which include comprehensive employee training

Immediate response to all unsafe situations is expected of all employees - the situation must either be rectified, reported immediately, or other measures taken to isolate the danger.

De Beers Canada will appoint an overall manager for all work sites, whose responsibilities will include safety and health. Supervisors will be held accountable for employees under their control and must ensure that equipment is safe, that their employees work in compliance with approved practices and procedures, and that they have had adequate training in the safe execution of their tasks.

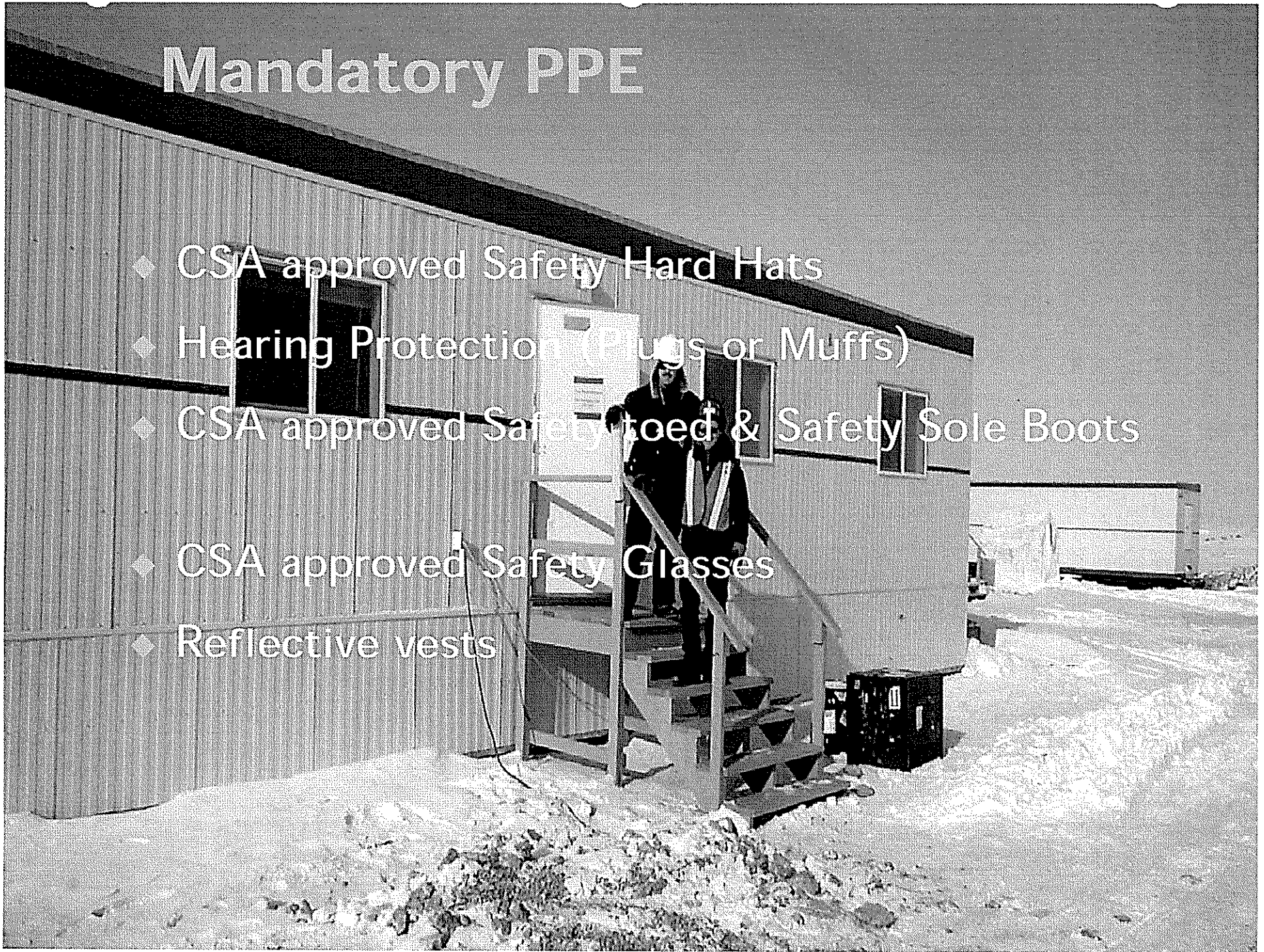
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Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

- ◆ The use of PPE is an essential part of your safety program and the extent of PPE required differs depending on where you are on the site and what you do
- ◆ PPE does not prevent accidents but minimizes the injury when an accident occurs
- ◆ PPE does not have to be worn in offices, accommodations area, or cafeteria-lunchroom-kitchen areas

Mandatory PPE

- ◆ CSA approved Safety Hard Hats
- ◆ Hearing Protection (Plugs or Muffs)
- ◆ CSA approved Safety Toed & Safety Sole Boots
- ◆ CSA approved Safety Glasses
- ◆ Reflective vests



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Site Rules and Guidelines

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Site General Rules

- ◆ Each person is expected to acknowledge these rules by signing a copy that will be kept on file
- ◆ Comply with all rules and procedures affecting the Snap Lake Diamond Project including all government regulations concerning safety, health and the environment
- ◆ Reflective safety vests or reflective striped coveralls/coats will be worn at all times when outdoors or underground

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Site General Rules

- ◆ Use materials and equipment in a safe and efficient manner
- ◆ Snap Lake Diamond Project is a dry camp - verified possession of alcohol or illicit drugs/substances will result in dismissal
- ◆ Sexual harassment will not be tolerated and may result in dismissal
- ◆ The removal of Company property from the site is theft and may result in dismissal

Site General Rules

- ◆ Practice good housekeeping at all times
- ◆ All visitors, technical reps, employees and contractors working at the Snap Lake Diamond Project must report all accidents, incidents, hazards or other concerns to their immediate supervisor
- ◆ This includes all injuries, occupational illness, property damage, fires, and spills of hazardous substances

Site General Rules

- ◆ Make "Safety" a consideration in everything you do – REMEMBER where you are!
- ◆ The collection of rock samples from the kimberlites, stockpiles, or from anywhere on the property will result in dismissal
- ◆ Only authorized personnel may collect ore/mineral samples or be near ore stockpiles

Site General Rules

- ◆ All areas that display a security restricted access sign are out of bounds to all persons unless specifically authorized - only staff that work in these areas, or visitors with authorization will be allowed entry

Site General Rules

- ◆ De Beers reserves the right to carry out searches of persons' personal belongings, work area, and accommodation. These searches will take place in the person's presence, with a witness. All searches will be appropriately recorded.

Site General Rules

- ◆ Cameras of any type are not permitted on the site without prior permission from the De Beers Site Supervisor
