

Regulatory Authority

Licences and permits issued by the Government of the Northwest Territories include:

- Archaeologist research permits under the Northwest Territories Archaeology Site Regulation pursuant to the Northwest Territories Act,
- Scientific licences pursuant to the Northwest Territories Scientist Act,
- Those required under Public Health Act and Camp Sanitation Regulations, Eating or Drinking Places Regulation, General Sanitation Regulations, and Communicable Diseases Regulations.

Responsible Minister

The Government of the Northwest Territories administers the following acts and regulations throughout the Northwest Territories:

- Northwest Territories Environmental Protection Act and Regulations,
- Northwest Territories Wildlife Act and Regulations,
- Northwest Territories Forest Management Act and Regulations,
- Northwest Territories Forest Protection Act and Regulations, and
- Northwest Territories Transportation of Dangerous Goods.

The Government of the Northwest Territories shares responsibility for social well being and economic development with other levels of government. It is also responsible for:

- Management of wildlife and its habitat,
- Management of forest including fire protection,
- Environmental protection including spills,
- Air quality and related guidelines, and
- Shared responsibility for management and protection of archaeological sites throughout the Northwest Territories.

The Government of the Northwest Territories is also responsible for the management of social, cultural and economic impact and opportunities associated with the above. The territorial government also promotes and supports the enhancement and preservation of languages, cultures and heritage of the Northwest Territories, analyzing labour force developments and implementing responsive strategies to achieve meaningful employment for northerners.

The territorial government also assesses properties in all Northwest Territories communities except Yellowknife and all property outside of community boundaries.
