

**Re: Notice of Referral to Environmental Assessment – Ur-Energy Inc.-Screech Lake, east of Great Slave Lake.**

On May 3, 2005 the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board referred your Land Use Permit application (MV2005C0007) for mineral exploration at Screech Lake area East of Great Slave Lake, Northwest Territories to Environmental Assessment, according to section 125(1) of the Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act. The Mackenzie Valley Environmental Impact Review Board will determine the scope of the project and of the assessment, and will provide you with a draft Terms of Reference and Work Plan shortly.
