The Workplan has already been sent out. It should be in your inbox. Please let me know if it isn't.

The Board felt, during the last EAs on exploration in the area, that the most valuable evidence came from the testimony during the hearing. It structured the workplans for both Sidon and CGV accordingly.

For Consolidated Goldwin, the application includes a slightly modified version of the DAR that was produced last time the Board assessed CGV's proposed exploration in the area. Please check out the Land Use Permit application (the MVLWB web site has it on line).

For Sidon, the Board felt that the application has enough information in it to proceed.

However, if this approach (straight to IRs and getting on with a hearing) doesn't give the Board the information it needs to make its decisions, it will proceed to Phase II. Phase II is the usual process, with a ToR, DAR and so forth. But right now, the Board wants to see what information it can get from a round of IRs and a community hearing.
