RE: Avalon Rare Metals Inc.'s Thor Lake Rare Earth Element Project Environmental Assessment under the Mackenzie Valley Enironmental Impact Review Board and the section 23 Governor in Council Proclamation of the *Navigable Waters Protection Act*

This letter is to notify the Mackenzie Valley Environmental Impact Review Board (MVEIRB) that Avalon Rare Metals Inc. requires a *Navigable Waters Protection Act* (NWPA) section 23 Governor in Council (GIC) Proclamation of exemption. The section 23 is required as a result of the section 22 NWPA prohibition towards the deposition or throwing of any material that is liable to sink to the bottom in any water, any part of which is navigable or that flows into any navigable water, where there are not at least 20 fathoms (approximately 36.6 meters) of water depth at all times. This is applicable to the Thor Lake Rare Earth Element Project in the Northwest Territories.

Transport Canada (TC) notified Avalon Rare Metals Inc. in a letter dated October 9, 2012 (attached) that they would have to obtain a Proclamation of exemption by the GIC under section 23 of the NWPA. Avalon Rare Metals Inc. recently submitted notification and a section 23 application to TC for review in a letter dated November 13, 2012. The regulatory process for section 23 will be formally initiated following the completion of the 'Decision Phase' of the Environmental Assessment.

RE: Governor in Council Proclamation of exemption process pursuant to Section 23 of the Navigable Waters Protection Act, Northwest Territories

We understand that Avalon Rare Metals Inc. is proposing to deposit tailings into the below listed waterways as part of its Thor Lake Rare Earth Element Project. Transport Canada (TC) has determined that the listed waterways are navigable and considers the depositing of tailings in the waterways to be subject to section 22 of the *Navigable Waters Protection Act* (NWPA). As you are likely aware, section 22 prohibits a person from throwing or depositing any material or rubbish (e.g. stone, gravel, earth, cinders, ashes) that is liable to sink to the bottom in any water, any part of which is navigable or that flows into any navigable water, where there are not at least 20 fathoms (approximately 36.6 meters) of water depth at all times.

Section 23 of the NWPA provides that the Governor in Council, when it is shown to its satisfaction that the public interest would not be injuriously affected, may, by proclamation, declare any rivers, streams or waters in respect of which section 22 of the NWPA apply, or any parts thereof, exempt in whole or in part from the operation of section 22. Therefore, in order to deposit tailings into the listed waterways or to proceed with any undertaking that would allow the depositing of tailings such as dewatering the waterways, it is necessary for Avalon Rare Medals Inc. to first obtain a Proclamation of exemption by the Governor in Council under section 23 of the NWPA.

As with other NWPA approvals, an application needs to be submitted to TC if Avalon Rare Medals Inc. wishes to seek a Proclamation of exemption under section 23 of the NWPA. To this end, Avalon Rare Metals Inc. must inform TC in writing that it wishes to apply for a Proclamation of exemption.

Avalon Rare Metals Inc. must also submit an application to TC with all the necessary information in support of a Proclamation of exemption. The information requirements are described in the attached document "Proclamation of exemption process pursuant to section 23 of the *Navigable Waters Protection Act*" for the Thor Lake Rare Earth Element Project.

Canada

We do not anticipate this application process being too onerous as much of the information is already contained in the work you are completing for the Environmental Impact Statement.

Canada, as you know, must be satisfied that its legal duty to consult Aboriginal groups in relation to the project is met before a Proclamation of exemption can be granted by the Governor in Council.
