Preamble

On May 18, 2011 Alex Debogorski met with various government representatives and the Land and Water Board. The Review Board was provided with a summary of the meeting. One of the subjects discussed at the meeting was the status of an archaeology report that the Prince of Wales Northern Heritage Centre (PWNHC) has on file that may be relevant to proposed Debogorski Development project. The meeting notes indicate that the PWNHC can either submit the report to the Review Board in confidence or provide a summary to the Board indicating the results of the report that are relevant to the developer's claim.

Response Addendum

The following is an addendum to the GNWT's response to Information Request #2 for the Debogorski Diamond Exploration Project filed on August 4, 2011.

The archaeological site information summarized in the IR response was partially incomplete due to a mapping error. The response indicated there were a total five archaeological sites located in Mineral Claim K03016 – Smitski # 1. After further review, it was determined there are actually six archaeological sites in the claim: KaPf-30¹, KaPf-47, KaPf-48, KaPf-49, KaPf-62, and KaPf-63.

The Prince of Wales Northern Heritage Centre (PWNHC) has filed a new map with the Review Board that shows the correct site data.

The new map also shows archaeological sites located within 500 m of the claim block. There are nine additional archaeological sites within 500 m of the boundaries of K03016.
