Executive Summary

De Beers' proposed Gahcho Kué Project (Project) will be the fourth diamond mine and De Beers' second diamond mine in the Northwest Territories (NWT). The Project is located approximately 280 kilometres (km) northwest of Yellowknife, NWT, at Kennady Lake which flows into the Lockhart River drainage system. The Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Project was submitted to the Mackenzie Valley Environmental Impact Review Board (MVEIRB) on December 23, 2010. Section 4 of the EIS provides an overview of De Beers' community, regulatory, and public engagement activities in support of the Project dating back to the exploration phase (i.e., in the late 1990's) and leading up to submission of the EIS. Following submission of the EIS, De Beers continued to actively engage the communities as documented in the *Gahcho Kué Project Community Engagement Update* December 24, 2010 to May 15, 2012, which was submitted to MVEIRB's public registry on June 14, 2012. This Community Engagement Update Report provides an update regarding De Beers' continued community engagement activities, conducted in support of the Project, carried out between May 16, 2012 and November 9, 2012 and is a follow-up to its last update.

Since the MVEIRB Technical Sessions in May 2012, De Beers has conducted various community and public engagement activities including the following:

- Distribution of the Gahcho Kué Now Newsletter, May and November 2012;
- Distribution of an updated Project DVD, June 2012;
- Kennady Lake Exploration Land Use Permit Amendment consultation, July – August 2012;
- Hosted site visits and workshops at the Project site with a delegation from Aboriginal groups, August – September 2012;
- Hosted Wildlife Monitoring Plan Working Group Meetings and Workshop, August – September, 2012;
- Hosted Fish Habitat Compensation Plan Workshop, September 2012;
- Educational Support for NWT Post-Secondary Students, September – November 2012;
- Distribution of the Gahcho Kué Human Resource Strategy to government, community and other organizations with mandate to train and employ NWT Residents;
- Participation in meetings hosted by the Akaitcho Dene First Nations and Tłıchǫ Government to discuss an alternative to the Adaptive Management Committee presented at the May 2012 Technical, October-November 2012; and
- Maintained communications with all interested parties.

The Project site visits and workshops in particular provided opportunities for Aboriginal groups to receive more information directly from De Beers about the Project and for Aboriginal groups to provide their input to De Beers on the Project including proposed monitoring programs. De Beers provided capacity funding for these meetings, site visits and workshops to Aboriginal groups to enable them to contribute / offer Traditional Knowledge (TK) or to retain scientific or Traditional Knowledge experts.

Throughout all of these more recent engagement activities, De Beers has observed that participants continue to learn about the proposed Project. De Beers has also observed that the concerns expressed by Aboriginal groups continue to fall within the scope of the EIS and that no new issues have emerged. Accordingly, De Beers has focussed on explaining how Project design addresses these concerns with supporting references to the EIS and supplementary information. As the permitting process progresses, De Beers is hearing concerns shift away from the Project design to the implementation of environmental management and monitoring plans. In response, De Beers has collaborated with communities to seek their input and integrate their unique knowledge into Project environmental management and monitoring plans. De Beers will continue to engage communities in the evolution and implementation of those plans.

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1 INTRODUCTION

De Beers Canada Inc. (De Beers) has prepared this Community Engagement Update Report (Report) for its Gahcho Kué Project (Project) for submission to the Mackenzie Valley Environmental Impact Review Board (MVEIRB) and representatives from Aboriginal groups. The Aboriginal groups include the Deninu Kue First Nation (DKFN); the Łutsel K'e Dene First Nation (LKDFN); the North Slave Métis Alliance (NSMA); the Northwest Territory Métis Nation (NWTMN); the Tłıchǫ Government (Tłıchǫ); and the Yellowknives Dene First Nation (YKDFN).

This Report is a follow-up to De Beers' Gahcho Kué Project Community Engagement Update – December 24, 2010 to May 15, 2012 (De Beers 2012) and Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) Section 4, Community, Regulatory, and Public Engagement, dated December 2010 (De Beers 2010). It describes De Beers' community engagement activities that have occurred since the previous update (May 16, 2012 to November 9, 2012). It is formatted to describe specific activities with each Aboriginal group in chronological order for ease of review by multiple interested parties. Regulatory activity is excluded from this update as De Beers has filed regular updates including minutes and action items with the MVEIRB following meetings with regulatory agencies.

Over the period of this update, De Beers has focussed its efforts on building positive relationships with communities and advancing engagement to a point where Aboriginal groups have shared their Traditional Knowledge (TK), guidance and advice. DeBeers has hosted site workshops that provided communities with opportunities to share their unique perspectives, including how to incorporate their TK into the Project. This process of continuing to engage the communities will be ongoing as the Project moves forward.

2 GENERAL ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

2.1 Wildlife Monitoring Plan Meetings and Workshop

At the MVEIRB Technical Sessions in May 2012, De Beers committed to support TK monitoring for the Project and implement a collaborative approach with communities and regulators in developing the Wildlife Monitoring Plan (WMP). The Panel's technical advisor on wildlife suggested that De Beers coordinate a WMP Working Group to help develop the WMP in collaboration with Aboriginal group representatives and regulators. The Tłıchǫ further suggested that De Beers could hold a Wildlife Workshop to obtain input from a broader audience. De Beers committed to both initiatives. The WMP Working Group meetings were held on August 7, 2012 and September 5, 2012 and the Wildlife Workshop was held on September 18, 2012. Information gathered during both the WMP Working Group meetings as Wildlife Workshop, including information collected from those TK holders were

captured and included in the Wildlife Effects Monitoring Plan (WEMP) that was submitted to MVEIRB's public registry on October 4, 2012.

2.1.1 Initial Meeting, May 25, 2012

Immediately following the MVEIRB Technical Sessions, on May 25, 2012 representatives of De Beers, Government of Northwest Territories Environment Natural Resources (GNWT ENR), MVEIRB Panel Consultant, YKDFN Consultant, Tłıchǫ Consultant, LKDFN, Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC) Cumulative Impacts Monitoring Program (CIMP), met to discuss the need for an innovative, collaborative approach to monitoring, particularly with respect to caribou. There was agreement on the value of initiating discussion on wildlife monitoring early in the Environmental Impact Review (EIR) and regulatory process. In addition to the commitments made by De Beers at the MVEIRB Technical Sessions, De Beers also committed to: (1) prioritize monitoring objectives for caribou, and propose monitoring actions at regional and local scales, the outcome of which would be provided prior to the Workshop; and (2) in preparing the monitoring objectives consider each of the effects pathways identified in the EIS along with the effects classification, biological relevance, probability, and consequence.

The meeting record was circulated to the Working Group for review and comment with agreement that GNWT ENR and De Beers would sign off. Signatures were dated June 1, 2012 and the meeting record was posted to MVEIRB's public registry on June 4, 2012.

2.1.2 Formation of the Working Group

On June 15, 2012, De Beers sent written invitations and followed up with phone calls to representatives from the following Aboriginal groups and government departments, indicating that there would be capacity funding provided for the Aboriginal Groups to participate in the WMP Working Group and a Wildlife September 2012 Workshop:

- DKFN;
- LKDFN;
- NSMA;
- NWTMN;
- Tłıchǫ;
- YKDFN;
- AANDC CIMP;
- Environment Canada (EC) – Canadian Wildlife Service (CWS);
- GNWT ENR; and

- MVEIRB Consultant.

The proposed approach, as described in the invitations, was that each Aboriginal group and government department send one (1) representative to the WMP Working Group and three (3) representatives to the Wildlife Workshop (September 2012). De Beers noted, in the invitations and follow up correspondence, that the primary objective of the WMP Working Group was to meet collaboratively to advance the objectives and approaches for the WMP and that the efforts undertaken by the WMP Working Group by way of meetings referenced below would be used to facilitate a Workshop on wildlife monitoring to be hosted by De Beers in September 2012. The Wildlife Workshop would include a broader group of participants and Aboriginal representation, ensuring continued opportunities to provide input on the WMP as well as the opportunity for TK holders to inform the WMP.

All parties contacted responded positively to the invitation regarding their participation in the WMP Working Group and Wildlife Workshop. On July 9, 2012, De Beers informed parties of its progress organizing the WMP Working Group, and noted that concerns had been raised by participants that the balance of the Aboriginal groups' intervener funding was insufficient to allow for their meaningful participation in the WMP Working Group meetings and Wildlife Workshop. Given the importance to De Beers of input from Aboriginal groups in the development of the WMP, De Beers stated that it was prepared to provide capacity funding to each Aboriginal group to support participation in the WMP Working Group and the Wildlife Workshop (September 2012). This included funding for travel, accommodations and per diems for the designated representatives to travel from their NWT office locations to the meeting in Yellowknife.

De Beers noted that the WMP Working Group discussions were expected to be technical and, as such, it was recommended that participants have an appropriate level of technical expertise. De Beers further noted that WMP Working Group Meeting #1 would focus on objectives, and caribou and surveillance monitoring, while WMP Working Group Meeting #2 would be topic specific to address carnivores, birds and other areas of wildlife monitoring identified at the first meeting. It was also noted in the invitation that WMP Working Group meetings would be held in Yellowknife, NWT and that for those unable to attend the meetings in person conference call would also be available. De Beers requested that parties respond to De Beers' proposed meetings dates by July 17, 2012.

2.1.3 Working Group Meeting #1, August 7, 2012

On July 23, 2012 De Beers confirmed the date of August 7, 2012 for the meeting. The meeting materials, including the Conceptual Caribou Monitoring Plan (CCMP) and Site Surveillance Monitoring Plan, were issued to participants on July 25, 2012. On July 27, 2012 De Beers distributed the details and agenda for the meeting, noting De Beers' preference that the meeting take place in person, but providing conference call-in details if necessary.

Participants at the meeting included one (1) representative from each of De Beers, Golder (De Beers' Consultant), NWT Treaty Tribal 8 Corp/Akaiicho Interim Measures Office, DKFN Consultant, LKDFN, NWTMN, Tłjchq Consultant, YKDFN), GNWT ENR, MVEIRB Consultant, and AANDC CIMP, for a total of eleven (11) participants of which two (2) participated by phone and a representative from the Canadian Northern Economic Development Agency (CanNor)/Northern Projects Management Office (NPMO) agreed to be the note taker for this meeting. Accordingly, all members of the WMP Working Group participated except for the NSMA.

The agenda included WMP Working Group introductions, objectives, and confirmation of agenda followed by discussion on the CCMP and discussion on Site Surveillance Monitoring, and then wrap-up and planning for the next meeting.

Action items agreed to by participants included:

- Sending out documents and links referenced during the meeting by August 7, 2012;
- Drafting meeting minutes by August 10, 2012;
- De Beers to update the draft CCMP based on the WMP Working Group discussion by August 17, 2012;
- Provide comments on updated draft CCMP by August 28, 2012;
- Next WMP Working Group meeting scheduled for September 5, 2012;
- Submission of meeting notes to MVEIRB to be revised for all to sign at next meeting; and
- Proposed WMP Workshop dates between September 18 and 21, 2012.

Following the meeting, on August 13, 2012, De Beers distributed draft meeting notes to the WMP Working Group for review and comment. On August 29, following receipt of comments on the draft meeting notes, De Beers circulated the final meeting notes to the WMP Working Group and then appended the notes to the Wildlife Effects Monitoring Program (WEMP) submitted to MVEIRB's public registry on October 4, 2012.

On August 21, 2012 De Beers distributed the revised CCMP, as well as a draft agenda for the second Working Group meeting scheduled for September 5, 2012. On September 3, 2012 comments on the CCMP were submitted to De Beers by the DKFN Consultant. Those comments were incorporated into final notes as well as the WEMP.

2.1.4 Working Group Meeting #2, September 5, 2012

The date for the second WMP Working Group meeting was confirmed at the close of the first meeting.

On August 27, 2012, De Beers distributed material for review prior to the meeting including:

- Wildlife Mitigation and Management Plan version 2;
- WMP;
- Wolverine monitoring protocol (Mulder et al 2007); and
- Grizzly bear monitoring design and background information.

Participants of the meeting included one (1) representative each of De Beers, Golder (De Beers Consultant), Akaitcho, DKFN Consultant, NWTMN, Tłıchǫ, YKDFN Consultant, GNWT ENR, AANDC CIMP, and Environment Canada (EC) for a total of ten (10) participants. All members of the Working Group participated except for the LKDFN, NSMA, and MVEIRB Panel Consultant. The representative from CanNor/NPMO was unavailable for this meeting and notes were recorded by De Beers.

The agenda included:

- obtaining signatures for meeting #1 notes;
- food waste management (to develop agreement on appropriate mitigation based on lessons learned and what has worked well);
- wolverine monitoring program (to clarify the objective of GNWT ENR's regional DNA hair snagging method, to understand how the monitoring information will be used, to discuss the appropriateness of the proposed study design, to suggest ideas for including communities in the program);
- grizzly bear monitoring program (to clarify the objective of the regional DNA hair snagging method, to understand how the monitoring information will be used, to discuss the appropriateness of the proposed study design, to suggest ideas for including communities in the program);
- birds (to clarify the Program for Regional and International Shorebird Monitoring (PRISM) method objective, to clarify the North American Peregrine Falcon Survey objective, to develop agreement on the conservation approach to bird monitoring, to suggest ideas for including communities in the program);
- review of comments on CCMP revision (time depending, discuss feedback on revision #2, to discuss the wording of monitoring objectives); and
- wrap up and September 18, 2012 Workshop planning.

Following the meeting, on September 17, 2012, De Beers circulated draft meeting notes to the WMP Working Group for review and comment. Upon receipt of comments, De Beers revised the meeting notes and appended them to the WEMP, Appendix C, which was submitted to MVEIRB's public registry on October 4, 2012.

2.1.5 Wildlife Monitoring Plan Workshop, September 18, 2012

De Beers hosted the Wildlife Workshop in Yellowknife, NWT with the intention to review the outcomes of the WMP Working Group meetings, as well as provide a venue for a broader group of representatives to provide input on scope of the wildlife management and monitoring plans for the Project. These include the opportunity for input from technical experts as well as TK holders.

Attendees included Aboriginal group representatives from the DKFN, LKDFN, NWTMN, NSMA, Tłıchǫ, and YKDFN, as well as representatives from, GNWT ENR, AANDC, MVEIRB staff and De Beers including Golder (De Beers Consultant). A workshop facilitator and four (4) interpreters were also present.

Following the opening prayer, review of the agenda, and sharing of participant expectations, De Beers presented the context of the Wildlife Workshop to the participants, emphasising that the WMP is a flexible document that will change over time as needed.

Draft caribou monitoring objectives were presented to the workshop participants to review in smaller “break-out groups”, revise as they saw fit and present their findings to all Workshop attendees. The break-out groups were organized to ensure a balance of participants from the past two WMP Working Group meetings as well as a De Beers representative.

The GNWT ENR shared two (2) carnivore monitoring presentations:

- grizzly bears in the surrounding area of the Project; and
- wolverines.

The purpose of the grizzly bear presentation was to review existing grizzly bear monitoring programs conducted at NWT mines and in Nunavut and to discuss possible study design options for the future including TK and community input. The wolverine presentation focused primarily on the value of wolverine hair snagging and the DNA data that it provides of the surrounding area in regards to wolverine habitat tendencies.

A representative of the Wildlife Division of GNWT ENR offered a presentation on the Biology Status Surveys of Peregrine Falcons which are currently listed as a species of special concern on Schedule 1 of the *Species at Risk Act* (SARA) due to their low number in overall population.

A representative of the Canadian Wildlife Service of EC addressed the topic of arctic monitoring and the PRISM approach with the Workshop participants. It was noted that the suggested PRISM shorebird monitoring method allows for community participation in the surveys and is an excellent opportunity to encourage further TK in the WMP.

At the conclusion of the meeting, De Beers noted that it was planning, where possible, to visit the Aboriginal communities again to continue Project planning discussions and that an updated record of engagement would be provided to the MVEIRB in November 2012. De Beers committed to carry out annual community engagement which includes coordinating the Adaptive Management Advisory

Committee (AMAC) or an alternative so that each Aboriginal group and government department can work directly with De Beers and provide input on the evolution of management and monitoring.

De Beers emphasized that its goal of the WMP and adaptive management will be to facilitate on-going sharing of traditional and local knowledge and science in environmental monitoring and improve communication with communities and government departments. This approach will facilitate De Beers' commitment to support TK for the life of the Project.

The presentations given at this Workshop are included in Appendix D of this Report.

Following the Workshop, on October 4, 2012 De Beers submitted its Wildlife Effects Monitoring Program and revised Wildlife Effects Mitigation and Management Plan to the MVEIRB. On November 1, 2012 De Beers submitted a Gahcho Kué Wildlife Monitoring Workshop Summary Report to the MVEIRB prepared by the Workshop facilitator, Momentum Training Services and informed the MVEIRB that at the request of the GNWT, the plans submitted October 4, 2012 would respectively be renamed the Wildlife Effects Monitoring Program (WEMP) and Wildlife and Wildlife Habitat Protection Plan (WWHPP). It should be noted that TK information gathered during this session is reflected in Section 1.2 of the WEMP.

2.2 Fish Habitat Compensation Plan Workshop, September 20, 2012

On September 7, 2012, in response to a letter dated July 30, 2012 from the NWT Treaty 8 Tribal Corporation, inquiring about Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) plans to consult with Aboriginal communities regarding the Project and specifically the fish habitat compensation plan, De Beers invited Aboriginal communities to a jointly hosted DFO and DeBeers meeting in Yellowknife on September 20, 2012. De Beers noted that the purpose of the meeting was to clarify any uncertainties surrounding how fish habitat compensation plans are developed and how priority is assigned to particular options to achieve no-net-loss, as well as to provide an opportunity for community members to express ideas and perspectives related to fish habitat compensation and potential off-site options.

To facilitate the logistics of planning the meeting in coordination with the Snap Lake TK and Aquatic Effects Monitoring Program (AEMP) Workshop as well as the Gahcho Kué Project Wildlife Workshop, De Beers requested that Aboriginal groups select the same representatives for all three (3) workshops. Consistent with De Beers' community engagement practice, capacity funding for participation in this workshop was provided by De Beers to assist in involving technical consultants or in paying honorariums to experts. In addition De Beers provided funding for travel, accommodations and per diems for the designated representatives to travel from their NWT office locations to the meeting in Yellowknife.

The Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop attendees included Aboriginal community representatives from the DKFN, LKDFN, NWTMN NSMA, Tłıchǵ, and YKDFN as well as representatives from DFO, De Beers, and Golder (De Beers Consultant). Meeting Notes, including the list of participants, was

included as an appendix to the Draft No Net Loss Plan (NNLP) that was submitted to MVEIRB's public registry on November 16, 2012.

Following the opening prayer, review of the agenda, and sharing of participant expectations, DFO provided a presentation on their policy of how fish habitat compensation can achieve no net loss and examples from previous projects. Participants expressed concern with impending *Fisheries Act* changes and how those changes may affect current policies as well as potential future agreements. DFO acknowledged the uncertainty suggesting that there may be consideration to grandfather any key agreements or existing policies agreed upon prior to the *Fisheries Acts* revisions. Participants requested that DFO visit the communities throughout the development process for the Project.

De Beers followed with a presentation describing the Project and the proposed fish compensation plan. During the presentation, De Beers referred to concerns expressed by community members during visits to the Project site over the summer as well as a meeting in Łutsel K'e on July 19th, 2012. De Beers emphasized that it is in the information-collecting stage and that the Fish Habitat Compensation Plan/NNLP will not be finalized until the water licence and land use phase of the Project.

Workshop participants were then encouraged to form smaller, break out groups to discuss options to work towards achieving a NNLP for the Project. Each group included representatives from DFO, De Beers, Golder, and the Aboriginal communities. Follow the break out group discussions, each group presented their findings. The general themes discussed included: (1) the need by communities for more consultation including regular information sharing, consultation with fishermen, Elders, and community members; (2) time required for community representatives to report back to their communities, to research and generate ideas; (3) involvement of community through monitoring; (4) community distrust of industry based on past experience; and (5) lessons learned from other industry-based models and past experiences. Representatives from both the NSMA and LKDFN did not choose to participate in the break-out group discussions.

At the conclusion of the Workshop, participants generally expressed positive feedback about the Workshop noting appreciation for the opportunity to work together and express concerns, learning about NNLP and DFO's role, and emphasizing the need for further community consultation.

De Beers agreed to submit an updated draft NNLP to the MVEIRB on November 13, 2012 that included input from the Workshop as well as to continue to engage the communities on potential options as part of the water licence and land use permit phase and prior to the final submission of the NNLP.

The presentations given at this Workshop are included in Appendix E of this Report.

2.3 Alternative to Adaptive Management Advisory Committee

2.3.1 Workshop, October 23, 2012

On October 16, 2012 the Akaitcho Interim Measures Agreement (IMA) Implementation Office/Treaty 8 Tribal Corporation invited De Beers to attend an afternoon workshop on October 23, 2012 in Łutsel K'e to discuss potential extra-regulatory instruments and oversight models for the Project as an alternative to the AMAC proposal presented by De Beers at the technical sessions in May 2012. De Beers confirmed its attendance that same day upon receipt of the invitation.

The Workshop, hosted by the Akaitcho was held at the Łutsel K'e Community Centre and participants included two (2) representative of the Akaitcho IMA Implementation Office/Treaty 8 Tribal Corporation; one (1) LKDFN; two (2) YKDFN; three (3) DKFN; one (1) Tłıchq; and two (2) De Beers. De Beers was advised that the NWTMN had been invited, but they were unable to attend and that representative from the Akaitcho IMA Implementation Office/Treaty 8 Tribal Corporation had agreed to keep the NWTMN informed about the Workshop results. De Beers was advised and agreed to inform the NSMA.

The Workshop was held over two (2) days, and De Beers was invited to participate in the afternoon of the second day October 23, 2012. The objectives of the Workshop were: (1) To develop a draft model for the oversight of upcoming mines in the Akaitcho and Tłıchq territories; and (2) To consider extra-regulatory approaches to ensure responsible environmental management and monitoring. The Akaitcho and Tłıchq technical representatives had reviewed De Beers's AMAC proposal, developed draft alternatives and considered the need for an extra-regulatory instrument. On the afternoon of October 23, 2012 parties presented their draft proposal to De Beers, to explore opportunities for collaboration.

Following a discussion of their proposal including its purpose, provisions, challenges, and comparisons to other instruments, De Beers sought clarification and provided initial feedback and agreed to review the draft proposal and provide more detailed feedback to determine if there was sufficient common ground to continue the discussion and advance the proposal. De Beers verbally provided feedback on the draft proposal during a conference call on October 26, 2012 with Akaitcho and Tłıchq technical representatives. Following the October 26, 2012 conference call, it was agreed that there was sufficient common ground to advance the proposal. On October 29, 2012, De Beers provided comments on the Draft Proposal – Extra Regulatory Instrument and Oversight for Gahcho Kué Diamond Mine to the Akaitcho and Tłıchq technical representatives and a second meeting was scheduled for October 30, 2012.

2.3.2 Meeting, October 30, 2012

On October 19, 2012 the Akaitcho IMA Implementation Coordinator/Treaty 8 Tribal Corporation inquired about AANDC and GNWT's availability to participate in a meeting on October 30, 2012 in Yellowknife to consider an alternative model to the AMAC proposal presented by De Beers at the technical sessions in May 2012. The meeting was hosted by representatives from the Akaitcho Dene First Nation and Tłıchǫ with De Beers in attendance. It was noted in the invitation that although the NWTMN were invited, they were unable to attend but representatives from Akaitcho would inform them of the meeting results.

The purpose of the meeting was to advance discussions on an alternative model. Participants in the meeting included one (2) representative of the Treaty 8 Tribal Corporation/ Akaitcho IMA Office (one participant on conference call); one (1) LKDFN (on conference call); two (2) YKDFN; two (2) DKFN (on conference call); one (1) Tłıchǫ (on conference call); two (2) De Beers; two (2) GNWT; and two (2) AANDC.

Participants discussed De Beers' comments on the draft proposal. De Beers and the Aboriginal representatives listed above agreed on the purpose, objective, and key elements of the alternative model. Parties further discussed government participation in this model as well as differences between this alternative and the other environmental agreements, and agreed to continue the discussion at a follow-up meeting. On November 9th, 2012 De Beers contacted representative from the NSMA to update them on this possible alternative. The NSMA requested information that they could review on the proposed approach. De Beers stated that once there is a final agreed upon approach that information would be forwarded to the NSMA. De Beers mentioned that there would be a follow-up call later in November as well as draft documents would be emailed to the NSMA.

2.3.3 Meetings, November 9, 2012

A follow-up meeting was held on November 9, 2012 at the Tłıchǫ office in Yellowknife, NT. This meeting included representatives from Akaitcho IMA Implementation Office/Treaty 8 Tribal Corporation, LKDFN, YKDFN, Tłıchǫ and De Beers. The discussion further advanced the framework for the alternative as well as discussed support for a joint presentation at the Public Hearings. Participants in the meeting stated that they would be reviewing with their respective leadership support for a joint presentation with De Beers at the Public Hearing.

2.4 Gahcho Kué Now Newsletter

On June 13, 2012 De Beers distributed its spring edition of Gahcho Kué Now, a periodic publication, containing information and updates about the Project. In this issue, information about De Beers' adaptive management approach to the Project, improvements to engineering design to address potential environmental impacts, De Beers' community engagement efforts in 2012, water management and other issues were explained. The publication was mailed to households in communities close to the Project as well as those who have registered with De Beers to be on a distribution list for the Project. It was also inserted into the NWT News/ North in Yellowknife, Hay River, and Fort Smith. A copy of this publication is included in Appendix F of this Report.

2.5 Educational Support for NWT Post-Secondary Students

On September 25, 2012, De Beers advised the leaders of the Aboriginal communities about opportunities for educational support for NWT post-secondary students noting that De Beers had just announced \$30,000 in new scholarships available for NWT resident students enrolled or registered in a post-secondary program on a study area applicable to the mining industry such as Mine Engineering, Environmental Science, Finance and Accounting (Commerce) or Safety and Health, as well as others.

The initiative is part of De Beers' concerted effort to increase opportunities for NWT residents to participate in professional and managerial careers in the mining industry in the NWT with its company focussing strategically in those areas where it is having difficulty finding skills in the NWT. In keeping with De Beers' commitment to encourage women to participate in mining, the company also aimed to award half of the available scholarships to women.

De Beers provided communities with details regarding eligibility for the scholarship program, as well as a copy of its NWT scholarship application package so that it could be made available in the community offices and promoted to its membership.

The deadline for applications was October 31, 2012. At the time of writing this Report, De Beers is reviewing the applications.

2.6 Site Workshops

De Beers hosted site workshops at the Project site during the summer of 2012 with a delegation from each of the Aboriginal communities. The invitation to participate in these site-based workshops was extended to community leaders. Upon receiving confirmation of interest in participating and

confirmation of available dates, De Beers coordinated the details and logistics of the site workshops with the respective community representatives.

The purpose of the site workshops was to provide an opportunity to share De Beers' knowledge about the Project as well as provide an opportunity for participants to share their knowledge and provide guidance to De Beers. The site workshop was designed to view the Project from three (3) important perspectives:

- From the Air, via helicopter – a tour of the Gahcho Kué area provided an overview of the expected changes to air, land, and water and provided an opportunity for participants to see first-hand the lake levels, shorelines, and to follow the flows of the watershed.
- From the Land – De Beers' archaeologist set up a site to demonstrate the methods used for the Project to locate and uncover artifacts left behind by ancestors. She explained the legislation governing the collection of artifacts and to show some of the artefacts collected at the Gahcho Kué site. In addition, De Beers staff outlined the methods used for wolverine and grizzly bear monitoring programs and showed monitoring site maps and equipment used to collect DNA samples.
- From the Water, via boat – on Kennady Lake, workshop participants were shown the locations of the three (3) kimberlite deposits and discussed the expected changes to the Lake that will occur during construction, operation, and closure.

By offering all three (3) perspectives De Beers believes that all participants gained a better understanding of the Project and participants were therefore in a better position to share valuable input and guidance on several key components of the Project including: fish salvage, monitoring programs, closure plans, fish habitat enhancements, etc.

While De Beers does not normally provide capacity funding to communities for company hosted site visits, this site-based workshop was structured to ensure active participation, involvement and the opportunity for communities to select Elders to attend, as well as members of land and environment committees who have important and unique knowledge and expertise to contribute to the Project. As such, capacity funding assistance was made available to all Aboriginal groups so they could arrange for the inclusion of Elders and other experts, who could, on the community's behalf, bring their unique knowledge to the site-based workshop.

The agenda for each site workshop required one (1) full day. Each workshop agenda included the following:

- Check in at Yellowknife or community float plane base for pick up by De Beers
- Depart to Gahcho Kué
- Arrive at Gahcho Kué
- Safety Orientation and Welcome Breakfast
- Introduction and Overview of the Project
- Workshop – Activity 1 (helicopter, archaeology, or boat)

- Lunch
- Workshop – Activity 2 (helicopter, archaeology, or boat)
- Refreshment Break
- Workshop – Activity 3 (helicopter, archaeology, or boat)
- Refreshment Break
- Summary of Day’s Activities and Discussions
- Depart Gahcho Kué
- Arrive in local community/Yellowknife float plane base

Generally, at least five (5) representatives of De Beers attended each site workshop including its Permitting Manager, Superintendents of Permitting, Superintendent Community Relations, Archaeological Consultant, and Wildlife Consultant. Interpreters were also present at the site workshops.

Questions, comments, and concerns raised by the communities and the responses by De Beers are outlined further in this report in each specific community section.

The Work Book distributed and used during these workshops as well as the workshop presentations are included in Appendix C of this Report.

2.7 Environmental Impact Review Engagement

De Beers has maintained its engagement activities with communities and regulators through the MVEIRB EIR process. Since submission of *De Beers’ Community Engagement Update Report* from December 24, 2010 to May 15, 2012, the following stages of the EIR process have been completed:

- Technical Sessions May 22 to 25, 2012 in Yellowknife, NWT to encourage the parties to communicate and attempt to resolve technical and other questions;
- Submission of responses to undertakings from the Technical Sessions;
- Submission of responses to parties’ Information Requests Round #2, September, 2012;
- Submission of various plans, technical memorandums, etc. to address Project issues;
- Pre-Hearing Conference on November 1, 2012 in Yellowknife, NWT to
 - a) finalize the list of issues to be discussed at the hearing;
 - b) seek a clear description or amplification of the issues in a hearing;
 - c) encourage the resolution of an issue by alternative means;
 - d) set a time table for the exchange of information and for preparations for the hearing;
 - e) adopt procedures to be used at the hearing; and
 - f) consider any matter that may aid in the simplification and disposition of the hearing.
- Submission of responses to parties’ Technical Reports, November, 2012.

Throughout the MVEIRB EIR process, De Beers has engaged with the following regulatory agencies:

- AANDC;
- CanNor;
- DFO;
- EC;
- Government of Northwest Territories (GNWT) various departments including ENR; Education, Culture & Employment (ECE); Health and Social Services (HSS), Industry Tourism and Investment (ITI); and Prince of Wales Northern Heritage Centre (PWNHC);

- Natural Resources Canada;
- Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board (MVLWB);
- Parks Canada; and
- Transport Canada.

2.8 Public Communications

In addition to maintaining engagement with communities and regulatory agencies, De Beers has been open to communicating with other interested parties including industry, media, mayors, renewable resource boards, as well as private citizens through mail distribution of Project information and direct inquiries with De Beers' staff. In June 2012, De Beers distributed an updated DVD dated May 2012 containing in high resolution PDF format: (1) EIS submitted to MVEIRB December 2010; (2) July 2011 update (updates to Sections 8, 9, and 10 submitted to MVEIRB July 2011); and (3) 2012 EIS Supplement (updates to Project Description and relevant sections submitted to MVEIRB registry April 2012). This DVD replaced the DVD dated July 2011. The DVD was distributed to Aboriginal communities and to those who registered with De Beers to be on a distribution list for the Project.

De Beers also provided updates to the Project Plain Language summary in English, French, Tłıchʔ and Chipewyan translations and submitted to the MVEIRB public registry on November 20, 2012.

2.9 Communication Logs

A record of De Beers' communications with Aboriginal groups including emails, telephone calls, letters, and meetings is contained in logs located in Appendix B of this Report.

3 COMMUNITY SPECIFIC ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

3.1 Deninu Kue First Nation

As described above and detailed in Appendices C, D and E, DKFN representatives participated in the following engagement opportunities:

- Books in Homes Community luncheon (May 2012)
- WMP Working Group Meeting (July-August 2012)
- Wildlife Workshop (September 18, 2012)
- Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop (September 20, 2012)
- Site Workshop (August 20, 2012)
- Alternatives to the Adaptive Management Committee Workshop and Meetings (October – November 2012)

The following section provides additional engagement activities with DKFN as well as specific input provided by DKFN representatives.

3.1.1 Books in Homes Community Luncheon, May 29, 2012

On May 23, 2012, De Beers invited the DKFN to a community luncheon at the Antoine Beaulieu Community Hall in Fort Resolution in celebration of its annual *Books in Homes* event. Since 2010 De Beers has helped the students attending the Deninu School build home libraries through its *Books in Homes* event. De Beers arranged for a community caterer to provide a hearty lunch of stew, bannock, and salad. The purpose of inviting the DKFN to the community lunch was to respond to suggestions by the DKFN that De Beers should be providing informal opportunities for DKFN to meet members of the De Beers team in the community.

3.1.2 Wildlife Monitoring Plan

On June 15, 2012 De Beers invited DKFN to participate in the WMP Working Group. On June 20, 2012 DKFN confirmed its participation in the Working Group. On July 9, 2012 De Beers proposed the first WMP Working Group meeting and on July 31, 2012 DKFN confirmed its attendance. See Section 2.1.3 for additional details about the meeting.

The DKFN consultant attended the WMP Working Group Meeting #2 on September 5, 2012. See Section 2.1.4 for additional details about the meeting.

On September 3, 2012, prior to the Working Group Meeting #2, the DKFN consultant submitted comments on the second draft of the CCMP to De Beers and copied to the other members of the Working Group.

3.1.2.1 Wildlife Workshop, September 18, 2012

On September 6, 2012 the DKFN confirmed their attendance at the Wildlife Workshop. See Section 2.1.5 for additional details about this workshop.

3.1.3 Site Workshop, August 20, 2012

On May 3, 2012, in response to the DKFN's request for De Beers to reschedule its missed February, 2012 Workshop, De Beers proposed a workshop in Fort Resolution between June 22 and June 24, 2012. In doing so, De Beers further proposed that if those dates were not workable, then De Beers and DKFN could turn their attention to a combined site visit and workshop in the summer including key people from the DKFN. By June 19, 2012 De Beers had not received confirmation from DKFN regarding the proposed June workshop. In a conversation between De Beers and DKFN on June 19, 2012, De Beers noted that it was no longer in a position to offer the June dates as replacement for the February 2012 workshop. De Beers suggested that the next opportunity would be a summer site based workshop.

On June 22, 2012 De Beers wrote to DKFN following up on its June 19, 2012 conversation stating that it was looking forward to hosting a one (1) day event to share its knowledge about the Project and provide an opportunity for participants to share their knowledge and provide guidance to De Beers. De Beers had designed a site workshop to view the Project from the air, the land, and the water to encourage participants to share valuable input on several key components including fish salvage plans, monitoring program, closure plans, and fish habitat enhancement features as described in detail in its invitation brochure. De Beers offered to provide capacity funding for the site workshop to ensure active participation and involvement of DKFN Elders and land and environment committee members.

On June 28, 2012, DKFN confirmed the date of August 20, 2012 for the site based workshop.

The site workshop began with a group gathering for an opening prayer, introductions, and welcoming remarks followed by a safety orientation. A video about the Gahcho Kué Project was played to acquaint participants with the Project. The activities and schedule for the day were reviewed by De Beers and participants were divided into groups of three (3) members or representatives of DKFN for workshop activities.

Boat tours were provided to allow participants to see where the dykes will be built, the pits dug, the proposed camp location and where the processed rock will be placed. De Beers provided information

about the fish and fish health of Kennady Lake and surrounding waterbodies, the 'fish-out' plan and options for fish habitat in the lake, as well as an introduction to monitoring (water, fish, and sediment)

During the boat activity questions about filter dykes were addressed by De Beers and concerns were raised about the water levels downstream following de-watering of Kennady Lake. The particulars of the downstream flow mitigation plan were discussed with reference to matching normal freshet to allow fish, such as grayling, access to their spawning sites. Fish habitat compensation options were also discussed. De Beers noted that the raised lake option was not considered favourable to DKFN participants. This was also noted in the draft NNLP submitted to the MVEIRB public registry on November 13, 2012.

DKFN participants suggested a staggered fish-out program that coincided with key first nations events; involving youth and Elders; and sending the fish back to Fort Resolution to be dried and smoked. Participants agreed that conducting a fish tasting program as part of the AEMP at Kirk Lake was a good idea, particularly in combination with berry picking. Concern for potential contamination of the Lockhart River system and the effect of water quality on fish and wildlife was expressed. De Beers confirmed that monitoring of the downstream environment would be ongoing to capture any trends so that mitigation could be implemented if needed in a timely manner. De Beers further noted that water would be contained in Kennady Lake until its quality is acceptable for release to the downstream environment. De Beers discussed its plans with EC Water Survey of Canada to collect hydrometric data downstream of the Project.

For one of the land based activities, De Beers' archaeologist set up a demonstration site which she used to explain and demonstrate the method used to find archaeological sites at the Project. She explained the legislation governing the collection of artefacts. She provided an opportunity for participants to view, hold and discuss a number of artifacts recovered in the Project area, which she had obtained from the PWNHC on loan for this workshop.

During the archaeological activity, participants were intrigued by one of the stone tool artifacts and some suggested that the stone may have originated from the Slave River near the confluence of the Salt and Franklin Rivers.

Land activity also included a session on wildlife which included a review of the proposed wolverine and grizzly bear monitoring programs, maps showing sampling intensity and grid based design. De Beers noted that both monitoring programs would be coordinated with Ekati, Diavik, and the GNWT. De Beers also noted the role of the WMP Working Group and their work on the WMP.

Participants demonstrated interest in regional monitoring programs for caribou as well as interest in conducting muskoxen studies, as muskoxen had recently been observed outside of their known range near the Saskatchewan border. De Beers confirmed that muskoxen are studied as part of a broader monitoring program.

Participants suggested monitoring berries to gauge the effects of the mine and expressed concern about pipes used to dewater Kennady Lake becoming a barrier to caribou migration. It was suggested that

ramps be built to allow caribou passage. Following the site visit De Beers confirmed with its engineers that ramps will be installed. This was communicated to DKFN in a meeting that was held on November 16, 2012 and commitments were included in the WEMP.

Participants asked about the voltage of the bear fence surrounding the camp and asked how many wolverine had been observed in the area, noting that wolverine had been observed around the Simpson Islands scavenging from their hunting camps. In response to a question, De Beers promised to confirm with the GNWT whether wolverine could get injured while climbing the scratching posts. De Beers agreed to investigate the potential for helicopters to deter caribou from the area. The WWHPP (Appendix C of the WEMP) provides minimum flight altitudes to mitigate low level flight disturbance.

Helicopter tours were provided to get a 'bird's eye' view of Kennady Lake and surrounding lakes, discuss what the area will look like when the mine is operating (pits, dykes, water levels, etc.), discuss what the area will look like after the mine closes, and to provide an introduction to monitoring (wildlife, water and sediment quality, fish, and hydrology). They also allowed an opportunity for participants to see first-hand the lake levels, shorelines, and to follow the flows of the watershed.

General final discussions were about employment and business opportunities, reclamation, and consultation. The site visit and workshop was attended by thirteen (13) DKFN representatives including the Chief and Elders, as well as seven (7) representatives of De Beers.

Following the site visit, on August 21, 2012 the DKFN Chief wrote to De Beers expressing appreciation for the on-site workshop and noted it helped him to understand the development. He provided three recommendations, namely: (1) Development and implementation of an annual berry picking program, involving Elders, youth, and land users to see how the berries that the animals live on are changing. DKFN recommended that the monitoring program begin this year by inviting Akaitcho Elders to site; (2) Implement a monitoring program for the muskox in the Project area; and (3) Preparation of a draft Environmental Monitoring Agreement involving Elders, youth, and land users.

Pursuant to the DKFN recommendation number 1, on September 11, 2012, DKFN inquired again whether their Elders could visit the site again to pick berries. De Beers followed-up with a telephone call to the Chief advising that De Beers would not be able to undertake another site visit for berry picking this fall, but agreed to incorporate berry picking into the 2013 site visits and confirmed this subsequently in a letter dated September 20, 2012.

On August 22, 2012, De Beers followed up with the GNWT ENR (copied email to DKFN) regarding whether wolverine had been injured while climbing the scratching posts at other mines in the area. De Beers is not aware if the GNWT responded to this email request.

On September 20, 2012 De Beers responded in writing to all of the recommendations provided in the DKFN August 21, 2012 letter.

On November 2, 2012 De Beers confirmed, in writing, a meeting with the DKFN Chief and Council, along with Elders to take place on November 16, 2012 in Fort Resolution. The purpose of the meeting is to

update the DKFN regarding where the Project is at in the EIR process, to discuss the status of the TK Study and next steps, as well as to provide feedback to DKFN regarding what De Beers has heard from the DKFN throughout its engagement with them this year and how the company is responding. De Beers presented information that was collected during all engagement activities including the summer site workshop, WMP Working Group and Workshop as well Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop. It was mentioned that the WEMP TK Section 1.2, indicated that De Beers was considering the inclusion of berry picking and sampling in follow-up monitoring. It was also mentioned in the meeting that suggestions to stagger the fish-out so that fish could be transported during key cultural events as well as participation of elders and youth in the fish-out was noted in the Gahcho Kué Draft Fish-Out Plan that was submitted to MVEIRB's public registry on October 4, 2012. De Beers indicated that that fish tasting at Kirk Lake is being considered as part of the AEMP.

3.1.4 Fish Habitat Compensation Plan Workshop, September 20, 2012

On September 6, 2012 DKFN confirmed their attendance at the Fish Habitat Compensation Plan Workshop. See Section 2.2 for additional details about this workshop as well as in Appendix E.

3.1.5 Environmental Impact Review Engagement

In May 2012, the MVEIRB held Technical Sessions in Yellowknife, NWT. The DKFN were represented at the sessions by Elmar Plate (consultant).

On June 6, 2012 De Beers sent the DKFN a DVD dated May 2012 containing in high resolution PDF format: (1) EIS submitted to MVEIRB December 2010; (2) July 2011 update (updates to Sections 8, 9, and 10 submitted to MVEIRB July 2011); and (3) 2012 EIS Supplement (updates to Project Description and relevant sections submitted to MVEIRB April 2012). This DVD replaced the DVD dated July 2011.

On July 18, 2012 DKFN submitted eight (8) Information Requests (IRs) to MVEIRB's public registry and on September 13, 2012 De Beers submitted its responses to the DKFN IRs to MVEIRB and to DKFN.

On October 22, 2012 DKFN submitted its Technical Report to MVEIRB's public registry to which De Beers responded to MVEIRB and DKFN on November, 13, 2012.

On November 1, 2012, MVEIRB held a Pre-Hearing Conference in Yellowknife, NWT. The DKFN were represented at the session by Rosy Bjornson, and Marc D'Entremont (consultant).

3.2 Łutsel K'e First Nation

As described above and detailed in Appendices C, D and E, LKDFN representatives participated in the following engagement opportunities:

- Community Meeting (July 2012)
- WMP Working Group Meeting (July-August 2012)
- Wildlife Workshop (September 18, 2012)
- Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop (September 20, 2012)
- Site Workshop (August 22, 2012)
- Alternatives to the Adaptive Management Committee Workshop and Meetings (October – November 2012)

The following section provides additional engagement activities with LKDFN as well as specific input provided by LKDFN representatives.

3.2.1 Community Meeting, July 19, 2012

On May 23, 2012 De Beers contacted LKDFN and the Akaitcho Interim Measures Office, via email requesting a meeting to discuss the integration of TK into the monitoring plans with the Akaitcho communities, noting its availability in June and July.

On June 22, 2012 LKDFN thanked De Beers for the opportunity to meet in Łutsel K'e. Having discussed the possible dates with Chief and Council, the Wildlife, Lands, and Environment Committee (WLEC) requested a meeting in the community on July 19 or 20, 2012 to discuss the Environmental Management and Monitoring Framework (EMMF), the use of TK in monitoring programs as well as the AMAC. De Beers replied that same day noting that it would also like to add hydrology sites to the meeting agenda.

On June 26, 2012 LKDFN confirmed that meeting date for July 19, 2012 and informed De Beers of the topics decided upon by Chief and Council for discussion. On July 16, 2012 De Beers sent LKDFN the meeting itinerary. LKDFN replied to De Beers with its budget for hosting and attending the meeting. De Beers confirmed its financial support available for this meeting on July 19, 2012.

LKDFN opened the meeting on July 19, 2012 with a prayer and an introduction including a review of the agenda. De Beers followed with an overview of the Project providing an update on developments since De Beers had visited the community in February 2012. De Beers then provided a presentation on the EMMF focussing on terrestrial, aquatic, and air quality monitoring programs.

LKDFN followed with a presentation on the AMAC, and then discussed community engagement, terms of reference for the committee, the role of committee members in community engagement, and similar approaches used for other projects. De Beers agreed to consider examples of other companies that have employed approaches similar to AMAC.

Following a lunch break, the meeting reconvened on the topic of hydrology presented by Golder (De Beers' Consultant). De Beers provided a summary of the baseline hydrological survey assessment. Participants discussed terminology and hydrology monitoring including government maps, incorporation of TK, and monitoring stations. De Beers agreed to continue to engage Łutsel K'e on hydrometric monitoring. De Beers agreed to follow-up directly with the Water Survey of Canada to assess the connection between Kirk Lake and Fletcher Lake to assess if monitoring of the Hoarfrost River was required. An LKDFN Elder spoke about how the mine would increase air traffic and effects to air and water quality would affect traditional lifestyles, particularly with respect to trapping. The Elder further expressed concern for flooding when dams are built and the effect of flooding on fish, water flow, and burial sites. Another LKDFN participant noted concern for effects to the water quality in McLeod Bay and traditional use of the area. Trails and pathways were also noted as important land use for LKDFN members. Additional discussion items included the TK Study, the role of Transport Canada, and the potential for mercury levels to rise in the flooded areas. At the meeting and in subsequent submissions, De Beers indicated that they would follow Transport Canada's permitting requirements. It was also noted that in response to information request that potential for mercury level changes was addressed. In addition, De Beers will include monitoring mercury levels in the water and fish as part of the AEMP.

De Beers then provided a presentation about fish habitat compensation outlining the proposed plan, options, and incorporation of TK as well as a presentation about the fish salvage program including the de-watering program. Discussion items that followed included potential effects to the underwater ecosystem, requirements of DFO, and compensation to First Nations for loss of traditional lands. An Elder noted that if fish are moved to another area, they will eat different kinds of food and asked if studies had been conducted at other sites where fish had been moved. Other discussion items raised during the fish habitat compensation dialogue included hiring priorities and wildlife management including nuisance animals. De Beers included a section in the WEMP with respect to the procedures to address WWHPP, which is in Appendix C of the WEMP.

The meeting was attended by twenty six (26) representatives of LKDFN including the Chief, six (6) councillors, fourteen (14) Elders, two (2) wildlife committee representatives, one (1) environmental assessment representative, two (2) interpreters; as well as five (5) representatives of De Beers.

Directly following the meeting, De Beers thanked LKDFN for making the arrangements and ensuring participation. De Beers noted its availability to answer any subsequent questions or concerns.

De Beers followed up with LKDFN inviting them to a De Beers and DFO jointly hosted Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop on September 20, 2012 where De Beers indicated that the raised lake option was no longer being considered in the NNLP. In addition, as described in Section 5.4.2, of the Draft NNLP De Beers stated *"One such option that was identified during October meetings with the Łutsel K'e Dene*

First Nation was that De Beers could contribute to the removal of their diesel power generation facility in favour of a hydro system. According to the community members, every year during freshet, diesel leaks from the generator into a nearby creek. The removal of the generating facility and remediation of the receiving watercourse may meet Section 5.7.3 of DFO's Practitioners Guide To Habitat Compensation (DFO 2006). This is one example of an option that De Beers is considering and the NNLP will continue to evolve as additional community input is received.

3.2.2 Wildlife Monitoring Plan

On June 15, 2012 De Beers invited LKDFN to participate in the WMP Working Group. On June 19, 2012 LKDFN confirmed its participation in the Working Group. On July 9, 2012 De Beers proposed the first WMP Working Group meeting and on July 31, 2012 LKDFN confirmed its attendance. See Section 2.1.3 for additional details about the meeting.

3.2.2.1 Workshop, September 18, 2012

On September 13, 2012 LKDFN confirmed their attendance at the Wildlife Workshop via email. See Section 2.1.5 for additional details about this workshop.

3.2.3 Site Workshop, August 22, 2012

In response to comments made by the community during the February 15, 2012 public meeting and workshop in Łutsel K'e, De Beers wrote to LKDFN on April 23, 2012 with an invitation to consider sending a delegation to visit De Beers' advanced exploration camp at Kennady Lake in the summer to show proposed plans first hand on the land where the relative size of the Project, the direction and size of the flows of water and the impact of the proposed mine on the landscape can be more fully appreciated.

On June 22, 2012 De Beers again wrote to LKDFN following up on its invitation dated April 23, 2012 noting that it was looking forward to hosting a one (1) day workshop to share its knowledge about the Project and to provide an opportunity for participants to share their knowledge and provide guidance to De Beers. De Beers had designed a site workshop to view the Project from the air, the land, and the water to encourage participants to share valuable input on several key components including fish salvage plans, monitoring program, closure plans, and fish habitat enhancement features as described in detail in its invitation brochure. De Beers offered to provide capacity funding for the site workshop to ensure active participation and involvement of LKDFN Elders and lands and environment committee members.

On July 16, 2012, LKDFN confirmed the date of August 22, 2012 for the site workshop.

The site workshop began with a group gathering for an opening prayer, introductions, and welcoming remarks followed by a safety orientation. A video about the Project was played to re-acquaint participants with the Project. The activities and schedule for the day were reviewed by De Beers and participants were divided into groups of three (3) members or representatives of LKDFN for workshop activities.

Boat tours were provided to allow participants to see where the dykes will be built, pits dug, the proposed camp location and where the processed rock will be placed. De Beers provided information about the fish and fish health of Kennady Lake and surrounding water bodies, the 'fish-out' plan and options for fish habitat in the lake, as well as an introduction to monitoring (water, fish, and sediment)

During the boat activity, questions about filter dykes were addressed by De Beers and concerns were raised about the water levels downstream following de-watering of Kennady Lake. The particulars of the downstream flow mitigation plan were discussed with reference to matching normal freshet to allow fish, such as grayling, access to their spawning sites. Fish habitat compensation options were also discussed. De Beers noted that the raised lake option was not considered favourable to LKDFN participants; however, all participants were positive about the in-lake compensation options such as reduced Dyke B.

LKDFN participants provided input regarding the timing of the fish-out with cultural events involving youth and Elders, and/or a job fair. Participants also raised the option of transferring fish to Area 8. De Beers agreed to consider this recommendation. A participant suggested that off-site fish habitat compensation options should include concerns that the LKDFN have about Stark Lake where there had previously been an advanced exploration camp for uranium. De Beers agreed to follow-up with DFO regarding this suggestion. In Section 7.4 of the draft NNLP, De Beers stated *"Additional research on Stark Lake. There is a former uranium exploration site on the lake, and concerns were present regarding contamination of the lake from the site. Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC) has conducted an environmental site assessment to inventory materials and characterize the environmental conditions at the site, and has plans for additional work, potentially in 2013"*.

For one of the land based activities, De Beers' archaeologist set up a demonstration site which she used to explain and demonstrate the method used to find archaeological sites at the Project. She explained the legislation governing the collection of artifacts. She provided an opportunity for participants to view, hold and discuss a number of artifacts recovered in the Project area, which she had obtained from the PWNHC on loan for this workshop.

During the archaeological activity, a participant asked where the artifacts were housed. De Beers responded that they are housed at the PWNHC in Yellowknife and De Beers would be willing to set up a viewing with LKDFN representatives if interested. All participants were keen on involving LKDFN in future archaeological work. It was noted by one participant that there were more than eighty (80) archaeological sites around Kennady Lake. In response, De Beers mentioned that the TK Study being

funded by De Beers and being undertaken by LKDFN was an excellent opportunity for LKDFN to identify sites that are important to LKDFN and that, once the TK Study was available, De Beers would review the information provided about such sites. Participants recommended that archaeological sites be investigated near obvious hunting areas citing the location of Dyke A as an example and any shallow areas that would be obvious caribou crossings. The archaeologist confirmed that she investigated sites within the Project affected area that had a high potential for archaeological recourses.

Land activity also included a session on wildlife which included a review of the proposed wolverine and grizzly bear monitoring programs, maps showing sampling intensity and grid based design. De Beers noted that both monitoring programs would be coordinated with Ekati, Diavik, and the GNWT. De Beers also noted the role of the WMP Working Group and their work on the WMP. Participants demonstrated interest in regional monitoring programs for wildlife and suggested that eskers be used for grizzly bear monitoring. Participants also recollected anecdotal stories about wolf hunting and albino wolverine. De Beers stated during the workshop and noted in the WEMP that eskers would be sites included in the grizzly bear monitoring program.

Helicopter tours were provided to get a 'bird's eye' view of Kennady Lake and surrounding lakes, discuss what the area will look like when the mine is operating (pits, dykes, water levels, etc.), discuss what the area will look like after the mine closes, and to provide an introduction to monitoring (wildlife, water and sediment quality, fish, and hydrology). They also allowed an opportunity for participants to see first-hand the lake levels, shorelines, and to follow the flows of the watershed.

During the helicopter tour, a participant asked about the connection between Fletcher and Kirk Lakes to which De Beers responded that it does not believe the connection exists based on hydrological studies done by its consultant. De Beers also noted that the Water Survey of Canada would be visiting the site in September to visually assess the connection. A Hydrological Investigation of the Kirk Lake Watershed *DeBeers Canada - Gahcho Kué Exploration Site* was submitted to the MVEIRB public registry on November 13, 2012 that describes the Water Survey of Canada's assessment of the hydrological connection between Kirk Lake and Fletcher Lake. As noted in this submission based on a field investigation undertaken on September 12, 2012, *"There were no apparent surface flows occurring between Kirk Lake and Fletcher Lake. The height-of-land between the two lakes appeared to be several metres above either lake. A level survey could determine the elevations of both lakes and of the height-of-land. The potential for and direction of subsurface flows could also be determined from the elevation difference between the two lakes. Water level gauges on Kirk Lake and Fletcher Lake, referenced to a common datum, could give continuous water levels and the gradient between the two lakes."* De Beers is considering this recommendation as part of the hydrological monitoring program.

The day concluded with berry picking. The site visit and workshop was attended by eight (8) LKDFN representatives including the Chief and Elders, as well as seven (7) representatives of De Beers.

3.2.4 Fish Habitat Compensation Plan Workshop, September 20, 2012

On September 13, 2012 LKDFN confirmed their attendance at the Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop via email. See Section 2.2 for additional details about this workshop.

3.2.5 Environmental Impact Review Engagement

In May 2012, the MVEIRB held Technical Sessions in Yellowknife, NWT. The LKDFN were represented at the sessions by Michael Tollis, Wildlife Manager, George Marlowe, Elder, Pierre Marlowe, Elder, and Sheldon Yamkowy, community member.

On June 6, 2012 De Beers sent the LKDFN a DVD dated May 2012 containing in high resolution PDF format: (1) EIS submitted to MVEIRB December 2010; (2) July 2011 update (updates to Sections 8, 9, and 10 submitted to MVEIRB July 2011); and (3) 2012 EIS Supplement (updates to Project Description and relevant sections submitted to MVEIRB April 2012). This DVD replaced the DVD dated July 2011.

On July 16, 2012 LKDFN submitted five (5) Information Requests (IRs) to MVEIRB's public registry and on September 13, 2012 De Beers submitted its responses to the LKDFN IRs to MVEIRB and to LKDFN.

As requested by LKDFN on August 31, 2012, De Beers submitted a letter to the MVEIRB on September 7, 2012 supporting the LKDFN's request for at least one (1) day of the Public Hearings to be held in Łutsel K'e.

On October 22, 2012 LKDFN submitted its Technical Report to MVEIRB's public registry to which De Beers responded to MVEIRB and LKDFN on November 8, 2012.

On November 1, 2012, the MVEIRB held a Pre-Hearing Conference in Yellowknife, NWT. The LKDFN were represented at the session by Michael Tollis, Wildlife Manager.

3.3 North Slave Métis Alliance

As described above and detailed in Appendices C, D and E, NSMA representatives participated in the following engagement opportunities:

- Community Engagement Planning Meeting (July 2012)
- Wildlife Working Group Meeting (July-August 2012)
- Wildlife Workshop (September 18, 2012)
- Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop (September 20, 2012)

- Site Workshop (August 18, 2012)

The following section provides additional engagement activities with NSMA as well as specific input provided by NSMA representatives.

3.3.1 Community Engagement Planning Meeting, July 18, 2012

At De Beers' request, NSMA and De Beers met at the De Beers Yellowknife, NWT office to discuss the Project engagement plans.

Parties discussed goals and objectives for De Beers' proposed summer site workshop and the NSMA Community Engagement Policy. De Beers outlined that the purpose of its providing capacity funding for workshop participation is to assist the NSMA so that participants representing NSMA are able to speak on behalf of NSMA at the workshop. De Beers explained that the workshop is planned as part of the company's formal engagement with the NSMA. De Beers confirmed the expense of the August 2012 site based workshop included the provision by De Beers for capacity funding to NSMA for the workshop.

The NSMA agreed that De Beers' approach was appropriate and that representatives coming from the NSMA to the Gahcho Kué site workshop would actively engage and provide comments and feedback directly to De Beers on behalf of NSMA. NSMA confirmed that it would participate in the site workshop and would ensure that Elders, lands and environment staff, and other members of its leadership would participate and bring back the information to their membership. Parties agreed to proceed with the NSMA workshop on Saturday August 18, 2012. De Beers confirmed it would summarize the outcome of the workshop in writing and provide its notes directly to NSMA for validation as part of the follow-up NSMA membership meeting.

Parties discussed the NSMA's requirement for a post-workshop meeting with NSMA members. NSMA requested De Beers fund this additional workshop and the Parties discussed the terms that would need to be in place for De Beers to cover the costs of that workshop. De Beers outlined that it was prepared to fund the separate NSMA fall membership meeting/workshop on the following conditions:

1. NSMA will review the record of the site workshop provided by De Beers, validate that information is accurate with their members and provide written response to De Beers in that regard.
2. NSMA will document their suggestions on how to incorporate NSMA TK into operation and monitoring over the life of the mine and will provide to De Beers any other opportunities for TK to be incorporated into mine design.
3. NSMA will provide a report that summarizes their membership workshop outcomes, including the two points above. This report will be provided to De Beers in writing and will be delivered to De Beers in advance of the deadline for submission of Technical Reports in the EIR.

4. NSMA and De Beers will work out an acceptable letter of understanding in advance of the meeting that clearly firms up the scope and purpose of the NSMA fall membership meeting, the detailed budget and timeline, the requirements of the written report, including agreed delivery date and with payment terms that ensure final payment by De Beers is issued upon delivery of the final report.
5. The NSMA meeting and follow-up report will be scheduled such that the report can be delivered to De Beers in advance of the Technical Report deadline as part of the EIR.

Parties agreed to the terms and designated who in their respective organizations would finalize the details. An interim TK report was submitted by the NSMA to De Beers on November 19, 2012 for submission to MVEIRB public registry on November 20, 2012.

3.3.2 Wildlife Monitoring Plan

On June 15, 2012 De Beers invited NSMA to participate in the WMP Working Group. On the same day, NSMA confirmed its participation in the WMP Working Group. However, it did not participate in the WMP Working Group meetings. See Section 2.1.3 and 2.1.4 for additional details about the meetings.

On September 7, 2012 the NSMA confirmed their attendance at the Wildlife Workshop. See Section 2.1.5 for additional details about this workshop.

3.3.3 Site Workshop, August 18, 2012

In response to comments made by the community during the February 28, 2012 public meeting and workshop, De Beers wrote to NSMA on May 8, 2012 with an invitation to consider sending a delegation to visit De Beers' advanced exploration camp at Kennady Lake this summer to show proposed plans first hand on the land where the relative size of the Project, the direction and size of the flows of water and the impact of the proposed mine on the landscape can be more fully appreciated.

On June 22, 2012 De Beers again wrote to NSMA following up on its invitation dated May 8, 2012 noting that it was looking forward to hosting a one (1) day event to share its knowledge about the Project and provide an opportunity for participants to share their knowledge and provide guidance to De Beers. De Beers had designed a site workshop to view the Project from the air, the land, and the water to encourage participants to share valuable input on several key components including fish salvage plans, monitoring program, closure plans, and fish habitat enhancement features as described in detail in its invitation brochure. De Beers further offered to provide capacity funding for the site visit and workshop to ensure active participation and involvement of NSMA Elders and land and environment committee members.

On July 18, 2012, the date of August 18, 2012 for the site workshop was confirmed.

The site workshop began with a group gathering for an opening prayer, introductions, and welcoming remarks followed by a safety orientation. A video about the Gahcho Kué Project was played to re-acquaint participants with the Project. The activities and schedule for the day were reviewed by De Beers and participants were divided into groups of three (3) members or representatives of NSMA for workshop activities.

Boat tours were provided to allow participants to see where the dykes will be built, pits dug, camp and where the processed rock will be placed. De Beers provided information about the fish and fish health of Kennady Lake and surrounding water bodies, the 'fish-out' plan and options for fish habitat in the lake, as well as an introduction to monitoring (water, fish, and sediment)

During the boat activity, participants discussed the purpose of the filter dyke, and expressed concern about the water level downstream once de-water has occurred in Kennady Lake. De Beers provided the particulars of the downstream flow mitigation plan with reference to matching normal freshet to allow fish, such as grayling, access to their spawning sites.

Fish habitat compensation was also discussed and participants generally agreed that they were not in favour of the raised lake option. When offsite options were presented, participants suggested that work to enhance the fish stocks in Prosperous and Prelude Lakes should be considered. In the draft NNLP, submitted to MVEIRB's public registry on November 13, 2012, De Beers indicated that the raised lake option is no longer being considered. In addition, the options suggested by NSMA were also noted in the draft NNLP.

Questions were raised about the mine rock, particularly its placement in mine rock piles versus backfilling into mined out pits. In response, De Beers explained its mine plan. Participants identified potential business opportunities to help De Beers move rock.

For one of the land based activities, De Beers' archaeologist set up a demonstration site with she used to explain and demonstrate the method used to find archaeological sites at the Project. She explained the legislation governing the collection of artifats. She provided an opportunity for participants for view, hold and discuss a number of artifacts recovered in the Project area, which she had obtained from the PWNHC on loan for this workshop.

Land activity also included a session on wildlife including a review of the proposed wolverine and grizzly bear monitoring programs, maps showing sampling intensity and grid based design. De Beers noted that both monitoring programs would be coordinated with Ekati, Diavik, and the GNWT. De Beers also noted the role of the WMP Working Group and their work on the WMP. In general there was interest in further regional caribou monitoring.

Helicopter tours were provided to get a 'bird's eye' view of Kennady Lake and surrounding lakes, discuss what the area will look like when the mine is operating (pits, dykes, water levels, etc.), discuss what the area will look like after the mine closes, and to provide an introduction to monitoring (wildlife, water

and sediment quality, fish, and hydrology). They also allowed an opportunity for participants to see first-hand the lake levels, shorelines, and to follow the flows of the watershed. Concerns regarding water quality and quantity were discussed. De Beers indicated that as part of the AEMP, which would be developed during the water licence and land use permitting phase that details on water quality and quantity would be included in the plan.

The site workshop was attended by ten (10) NSMA representatives including the President and Elders, as well as six (6) representatives of De Beers.

3.3.4 Fish Habitat Compensation Plan Workshop, September 20, 2012

On September 7, 2012 NSMA confirmed their attendance at the Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop via email. The NSMA chose not to participate in the smaller break out groups or provide input on off-site fish habitat compensation options. See Section 2.2 for additional details about this workshop.

3.3.5 Environmental Impact Review Engagement

In May 2012, the MVEIRB held Technical Sessions in Yellowknife, NWT. The NSMA were not represented at the sessions.

On June 6, 2012 De Beers sent the NSMA a DVD dated May 2012 containing in high resolution PDF format: (1) EIS submitted to MVEIRB December 2010; (2) July 2011 update (updates to Sections 8, 9, and 10 submitted to MVEIRB July 2011); and (3) 2012 EIS Supplement (updates to Project Description and relevant sections submitted to MVEIRB April 2012). This DVD replaced the DVD dated July 2011.

On October 22, 2012 NSMA submitted its Technical Report to the MVEIRB to which De Beers responded to the MVEIRB and NSMA on November 13, 2012.

On November 1, 2012, the MVEIRB held a Pre-Hearing Conference in Yellowknife, NWT. The NSMA were represented at the session by Eric Binion.

3.4 Northwest Territory Métis Nation

As described above and detailed in Appendices C, D and E, NWTMN representatives participated in the following engagement opportunities:

- Community Engagement Planning Meetings (July and September 2012)
- WMP Working Group Meeting (July-August 2012)
- Wildlife Workshop (September 18, 2012)
- Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop (September 20, 2012)
- Site Workshop (August 21, 2012)

The following section provides additional engagement activities with NSMA as well as specific input provided by NSMA representatives.

3.4.1 Community Engagement Planning Meeting

3.4.1.1 Leadership Meeting, July 26, 2012

In the spirit of structuring a more formal working relationship, the NWTMN requested a meeting with De Beers through written correspondence dated May 16, 2012 to address a number of matters including capacity funding, pursuit of a TK Study, Project impacts and accommodation and their participation in the summer site workshop. On June 19, 2012 De Beers responded noting its availability. On June 27, 2012 NWTMN proposed an agenda and budget for funding the NWTMN delegation attendance at the meeting and on July 5, 2012 De Beers confirmed its financial support available for the meeting.

On July 26, 2012 De Beers and NWTMN met in Hay River, NWT. The meeting began with an opening prayer and introductions. The NWTMN also provided a copy of a TK Study proposal to De Beers. The first topic of conversation was about the number of participants invited to attend the WMP Working Group meetings and Workshop. NWTMN requested attendance of two (2) NWTMN representatives at the Working Group meetings whereas De Beers planned for only one (1) representative of each Aboriginal group at the Working Group Meeting to maintain the focus of the meetings, but three (3) representatives would be invited to the Workshop.

In response to NWTMN concerns regarding engagement of Métis, De Beers explained how it engages all six (6) Aboriginal groups by following its policies to ensure equal and fair treatment. De Beers outlined how its community engagement programs are shaped by community input provided through the EIR process as well as through direct meetings with the individual communities to understand their key issues. De Beers explained that it initiates engagement with a community by meeting with its leadership to outline its general community engagement plan for the year ahead, then works with leadership to customize the engagement activities for each community's specific concerns while working within the

boundaries of De Beers' policies and procedures for equality and fairness. De Beers outlined its policies for honorariums, capacity funding, and how it ensures fairness in community engagement noting that the number of geographic communities within an Aboriginal group is also taken into consideration.

Following De Beers' response, the NWTMN expressed interest in developing a longer term engagement plan that addressed their specific concerns. The Parties then broke for lunch. Upon reconvening, the following short and long term paths forward were agreed upon:

- De Beers would be available in August 2012 to work with the NWTMN to develop a longer term community specific engagement plan; and
- In the short term, the following engagement opportunities would be seized upon:
 - Moving forward with an Agreement between De Beers and NWTMN for a TK Study based upon the proposal received from NWTMN at the beginning of the meeting;
 - Planning an August site visit and workshop; and
 - NWTMN participation in the WMP Working Group and Workshop.

Parties shared contact information before closing the meeting with a prayer.

3.4.1.2 Community Engagement Meeting, September 7, 2012

In follow-up to the July 26, 2012 leadership meeting, on August 21, 2012 De Beers contacted NWTMN to schedule a meeting to discuss a long term community engagement framework. Parties agreed to meet on September 7, 2012 at the De Beers Yellowknife, NWT office.

Prior to the meeting, on August 28, 2012, De Beers forwarded NWTMN its Community Engagement – Looking Ahead schedule for the proposed Gahcho Kué Project to clarify the remaining planned opportunities for community engagement that De Beers was making available between November 2011 and July 2013. This schedule had previously been presented to communities in De Beers' Environmental Impact Statement Overview session, held with NWTMN participation in October 2011 and it was outlined again by De Beers at the Environmental Impact Statement Analysis sessions held by the MVEIRB in November 2011.

The meeting began with a brief discussion about the outcomes of the July 26, 2012 leadership meeting then shifted to a discussion about De Beers' Community Engagement – Looking Ahead schedule. NWTMN explained that it would like De Beers to consider putting in place a protocol agreement to advance community consultations as a "one-window coordination" approach to address issues of interest and concern for its members. De Beers responded by explaining that it follows its Working with Aboriginal Communities Policy and that the policy guides how it engages with communities and that it did not have a template agreement for community engagement as it has not entered into any such agreements. De Beers also explained that it does develop specific agreements for some aspects of its community engagement, noting for example the TK Study Agreement was an agreement De Beers and

the NWTMN had agreed would be the next step following receipt of the TK Study proposal from the NWTMN.

NWTMN noted that it understood De Beers' policy and was open to negotiating on this point. NWTMN suggested that they would send De Beers a protocol Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). De Beers agreed to review such an MOU and the parties discussed that perhaps in companion with the TK Study Agreement, such an MOU might be helpful in forming the basis for a more clearly mutual understanding on how De Beers would engage the NWTMN in the year ahead. Both parties noted these documents would have to be presented to their respective organizations for approval.

NWTMN requested that De Beers provide information regarding how it engages with communities and how it deals with agreed protocols. De Beers agreed to forward the requested information to NWTMN by September 21, 2012. This was provided to the NWTMN by email on September 25, 2012. The NWTMN responded by email on September 26 thanking De Beers for the information and again asking if De Beers had a template community engagement agreement while also offering to send the MOU template referenced in the September 7 meeting. To date, although De Beers has not received a template MOU from the NWTMN for consideration, De Beers and the NWTMN have entered into a TK Study Agreement, which was signed by both parties September 21, 2012. De Beers met with the NWTMN consultant on September 18, 2012 and provided maps and other materials to assist in their TK study. De Beers followed up with the consultant on October 15, 2012 to answer questions regarding their TK materials.

3.4.2 Wildlife Monitoring Plan

One (1) representative of the NWTMN attended the WMP Working Group Meeting #2 on September 5, 2012. See Section 2.1.4 for additional details about the meeting.

On September 10, 2012 the NWTMN confirmed their attendance at the Wildlife Workshop. See Section 2.1.5 for additional details about this workshop.

3.4.3 Site Workshop, August 21, 2012

In response to comments made by the community during the February 21, 2012 public meeting and workshop, De Beers offered the NWTMN an opportunity to participate in a summer site workshop at De Beers' advanced exploration camp at Kennady Lake to show proposed plans first hand on the land where the relative size of the Project, the direction and size of the flows of water and the impact of the proposed mine on the landscape can be more fully appreciated. De Beers requested that the NWTMN provide confirmation of its interest in participating in the site workshop no later than May 31, 2012. On May 16, 2012 the NWTMN confirmed its interest and availability for the site workshop.

On June 19 and 22, 2012 De Beers again wrote to NWTMN formally following up on its invitation dated February 21, 2012 noting that it was looking forward to hosting a one (1) day event to share its knowledge about the Project and provide an opportunity for participants to share their knowledge and provide guidance to De Beers. De Beers had designed a site workshop to view the Project from the air, the land, and the water to encourage participants to share valuable input on several key components including fish salvage plans, monitoring program, closure plans, and fish habitat enhancement features as described in detail in its invitation brochure. De Beers further offered to provide capacity funding for the site workshop to ensure active participation and involvement of NWTMN Elders and lands and environment committee members.

On July 30, 2012, NWTMN confirmed the date of August 21, 2012 for the site workshop.

The site workshop began with a group gathering for an opening prayer, introductions, and welcoming remarks followed by a safety orientation. A video about the Gahcho Kué Project was played to re-acquaint participants with the Project. The activities and schedule for the day were reviewed by De Beers and participants were divided into groups of three (3) members or representatives of NWTMN for workshop activities.

With respect to the mine design, participants commented on site reclamation activities, particularly the recovery of vegetation on the mine rock piles and referred to a vegetable garden on a fine processed kimberlite (PK) pile at Ekati.

Boat tours were provided to allow participants to see where the dykes will be built, pits dug, camp and where the processed rock will be placed. De Beers provided information about the fish and fish health of Kennady Lake and surrounding water bodies, the 'fish-out' plan and options for fish habitat in the lake, as well as an introduction to monitoring (water, fish, and sediment)

Having observed the relative size of Kennady Lake and the fish habitat, participants generally accepted De Beers' fish population estimates for Kennady Lake; however, participants were interested in knowing how many fish were removed during the Ekati and Diavik fish-out programs. Participants also recommended that the fish-out program include commercial fishers in Hay River so as not to affect their businesses. A participant asked whether Longnose suckers were present in Kennady Lake, noting that their absence from certain water bodies indicates little fish movement among lakes. Concern for migrating grayling was also expressed. De Beers responded in the workshop that a Fish-Out Plan is being developed that will include the input provided from the workshop. The draft Fish-Out Plan was submitted to the MVEIRB public registry on October 4, 2012. De Beers responded by stating that there was only one longnose sucker observed during the extensive sampling program. With respect to grayling migration, it was mentioned that a flow mitigation plan was submitted to the MVEIRB public registry in June 29 and October 12, 2012. De Beers also committed to providing NWTMT the GPS coordinates from the helicopter tour as well as Kennady Lake fish population estimates, which was provide to MWTMN by De Beers on September 19, 2012.

For one of the land based activities, De Beers' archaeologist set up a demonstration site which she used to explain and demonstrate the method used to find archaeological sites at the Project. She explained the legislation governing the collection of artifacts. She provide an opportunity for participants to view, hold and discuss a number of artifacts recovered in the Project area which she had obtained from the PWNHC on loan for this workshop.

During the archaeological activity, participants discussed the possible origin of a stone tool noting that it could have originated near Slave River, Salt River, or Franklin Sand River. The NWTMN noted that it should also be consulted on archaeology. It was also suggested that De Beers should consider including archaeological scholarships in its scholarship programs. De Beers stated in the workshop that this would be considered.

Land activity also included a session on wildlife which included a review of the proposed wolverine and grizzly bear monitoring programs, maps showing sampling intensity and grid based design. De Beers noted that both monitoring programs would be coordinated with Ekati, Diavik, and the GNWT. De Beers also noted the role of the WMP Working Group and their work on the WMP.

Participants commented on caribou avoidance of mines as well as concerns about road and caribou interaction at Ekati. Questions regarding the initiation of the joint wildlife monitoring plan, scratching post set-ups, public use of the spur road, and wildlife monitoring observations including muskox, predators, numbers, and trails, were asked. Knowledge of the use of wolf urine to deter beavers and the use of caribou as bait for wolverine (not grizzly bears) was provided.

Helicopter tours were provided to get a 'bird's eye' view of Kennady Lake and surrounding lakes, discuss what the area will look like when the mine is operating (pits, dykes, water levels, etc.), discuss what the area will look like after the mine closes, and to provide an introduction to monitoring (wildlife, water and sediment quality, fish, and hydrology). They also allowed an opportunity for participants to see first-hand the lake levels, shorelines, and to follow the flows of the watershed.

The site workshop was attended by nine (9) members of the NWTMN as well as six (6) representatives of De Beers.

Following the site visit, on September 19, 2012, De Beers provided the NWTMN the requested Kennady Lake fish population estimates and GPS sites from the site visit helicopter tour.

3.4.4 Fish Habitat Compensation Plan Workshop, September 20, 2012

On September 10, 2012 NWTMN confirmed their attendance at the Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop via email. See Section 2.2 for additional details about this workshop.

3.4.5 Environmental Impact Review Engagement

In May 2012, the MVEIRB held Technical Sessions in Yellowknife, NWT; however, the NWTMN were not represented at these sessions.

On June 6, 2012 De Beers sent the NWTMN a DVD dated May 2012 containing in high resolution PDF format: (1) EIS submitted to MVEIRB December 2010; (2) July 2011 update (updates to Sections 8, 9, and 10 submitted to MVEIRB July 2011); and (3) 2012 EIS Supplement (updates to Project Description and relevant sections submitted to MVEIRB April 2012). This DVD replaced the DVD dated July 2011.

On November 1, 2012, the MVEIRB held a Pre-Hearing Conference in Yellowknife, NWT; however, the NWTMN were not in attendance.

3.5 Tłıchǵ Government

As described above and detailed in Appendices C, D and E, Tłıchǵ representatives participated in the following engagement opportunities:

- WMP Working Group Meeting (July-August 2012)
- Wildlife Workshop (September 18, 2012)
- Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop (September 20, 2012)
- Site Workshop (September 13, 2012)

The following section provides additional engagement activities with Tłıchǵ as well as specific input provided by Tłıchǵ representatives.

3.5.1 Wildlife Monitoring Plan

3.5.1.1 Wildlife Monitoring Plan Working Group Meeting #1, August 7, 2012

On July 9, 2012 De Beers proposed the first WMP Working Group meeting and on August 3, 2012 the Tłıchǵ Government confirmed attendance of its consultant. See Section 2.1.3 for additional details about the meeting.

On September 25, 2012, De Beers forwarded the WMP Working Group meeting #1 notes to the Tłıchǵ's consultant.

3.5.1.2 Wildlife Monitoring Plan Working Group Meeting #2, September 5, 2012

One (1) representative of the Tłjchq attended the WMP Working Group Meeting #2 on September 5, 2012. See Section 2.1.4 for additional details about the meeting.

3.5.1.3 Wildlife Workshop, September 18, 2012

On September 11, 2012 the Tłjchq confirmed their attendance at the Wildlife Workshop. See Section 2.1.5 for additional details about this workshop.

On October 15, 2012 De Beers corresponded with Tłjchq, advising that the WMP had been submitted to the MVEIRB and advising that it would mail hardcopies of misplaced workshop materials to the attention of the Tłjchq office as requested by its Workshop representative.

3.5.2 Site Workshop, September 13, 2012

On April 17, 2012, in follow-up to the community public meetings and workshops held in February 2012, De Beers offered the Tłjchq an opportunity to participate in a summer site workshop at De Beers' advanced exploration camp at Kennady Lake to show proposed plans first hand on the land where the relative size of the Project, the direction and size of the flows of water and the impact of the proposed mine on the landscape can be more fully appreciated.

On June 22, 2012 De Beers again wrote to the Tłjchq following up on its invitation dated April 17, 2012 noting that it was looking forward to hosting a one (1) day event to share its knowledge about the Project and provide an opportunity for participants to share their knowledge and provide guidance to De Beers. De Beers had designed a site workshop to view the Project from the air, the land, and the water to encourage participants to share valuable input on several key components including fish salvage plans, monitoring program, closure plans, and fish habitat enhancement features as described in detail in its invitation brochure. De Beers further offered to provide capacity funding for the site visit and workshop to ensure active participation and involvement of Tłjchq Elders and members of its lands and environment committees.

On September 5, 2012, the Tłjchq Government confirmed the date of September 13, 2012 for the site workshop.

The site workshop began with a group gathering for an opening prayer, introductions, and welcoming remarks followed by a safety orientation. A video about the Gahcho Kué Project was played to re-

acquaint participants with the Project. The activities and schedule for the day were reviewed by De Beers and participants. Since the day was cold and windy, the Elders indicated that they did not want to participate in the boat activity. For that reason, participants were divided into two (2) groups for the archaeology and helicopter tours. After a break, participants would gather together into one group for the wildlife activity and berry picking.

For one of the land based activities, De Beers' archaeologist set up a demonstration site which she used to explain and demonstrate the method used to find archaeological sites at the Project. She explained the legislation governing the collection of artifacts. She provide an opportunity for participants to view, hold and discuss a number of artifacts recovered in the Project area which she had obtained from the PWNHC on loan for this workshop.

During the archaeology activity, participants shared information about Aboriginal terminology for describing quartz; traditional uses of small arrowheads; traditional uses of crevices; traditional caribou harvesting activities; and legacy experiences and observations at historical mines. De Beers noted that the regulations for mining had changed a lot over the years.

Land activity also included a session on wildlife including a review of the proposed wolverine and grizzly bear monitoring programs, maps showing sampling intensity and grid based design. De Beers noted that both monitoring programs would be coordinated with Ekati, Diavik, and the GNWT. De Beers also noted the role of the WMP Working Group and their work on the WMP. An Elder requested that De Beers maintain engagement with the community as the WMP were revisited and suggested that De Beers discuss the WMP with the other mines in the area. De Beers agreed and followed up on discussions on the WMP with representatives of the Tłıchǫ at a WMP Workshop on September 18, 2012. De Beers has incorporated lessons learned from other mining operations in the WEMP.

Helicopter tours were provided to get a 'bird's eye' view of Kennady Lake and surrounding lakes, discuss what the area will look like when the mine is operating (pits, dykes, water levels, etc.), discuss what the area will look like after the mine closes, and to provide an introduction to monitoring (wildlife, water and sediment quality, fish, and hydrology). They also allowed an opportunity for participants to see first-hand the lake levels, shorelines, and to follow the flows of the watershed.

During the participants' discussion about fish, De Beers was asked about baseline information about the lakes and fish habitat. De Beers described fish and fish habitat in the area through the use of posters and explained the process for achieving no net loss of fish habitat as well as the process for selecting fish habitat compensation measures. De Beers noted that a Fish Habitat Compensation Plan Workshop was scheduled for the following week. In response to participant questions about the creation of fish habitat, De Beers clarified that DFO approval was required to undertake the options De Beers proposed. De Beers further clarified that its Draft Fish-Out Plan did not involve moving fish to another location and requested participant input regarding its Draft Fish-Out Plan. Participants shared experiences at other mines that had undertaken similar Fish-Out Programs and provided recommendations including setting up an annual fish supply, fish tasting events, a camp for Aboriginal use, and incorporation of youth in any programs selected. This information was included in the Gahcho Kué Draft Fish-Out Plan and

recommendations will be considered and communities engaged prior to the fish-out. One Tłjchq Elder requested De Beers consult with the LKDFN on the subject, noting that this area was important to Łutsel K'e. De Beers responded by describing its community engagement program pointing out that De Beers was consulting the LKDFN about the Project. Participants were pleased that De Beers was consulting others about the Project.

During De Beers' presentation about temporary fish habitat loss during the mine life, an Elder expressed concern about explosive residue on rocks placed in the water and further expressed concern that De Beers discussions be open and encouraged transparency from De Beers. De Beers assured participants that the Environmental Impact Review process is an open public process designed to promote transparency, accountability, and to protect the land and water and that it was providing an update on its activities and discussions with all Aboriginal communities into this public process, including this site workshop. In addition, De Beers committed to including the Tłjchq in the development of the AEMP where water quality monitoring objectives would be determined.

Other concerns expressed during the site visit included the effect of dust on caribou habitat; return of the land to its natural state following mine closure; water quality following closure; and the height of mine rock piles and the dust generated by mine rock piles. In response to the concern regarding mine rock and dust, De Beers described how it designs mine rock piles to reduce dust generation and noted that other communities recommended that De Beers reduce the mine rock pile footprint by increasing its height. De Beers included dust monitoring assessment in the WMP and that a more detailed closure plan would be developed as part of the water licence and land use permit phase of the Project. The Tłjchq would be included in the development of those monitoring and management plans.

In wrapping up the site visit, participants thanked De Beers noting that the day was both enjoyable and educational. Participants looked forward to discussing the Project further.

The site visit and workshop was attended by eight (8) Tłjchq representatives including six (6) Elders, as well as six (6) representatives of De Beers. The communities of Behchokq, Whatì, and Gamètì were represented by two (2) members each, and the community of Wekweètì was not represented.

3.5.3 Fish Habitat Compensation Plan Workshop, September 20, 2012

On September 7, 2012, the Tłjchq confirmed their attendance at the Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop. See Section 2.2 for additional details about this workshop.

3.5.4 Environmental Impact Review Engagement

In May 2012, the MVEIRB held Technical Sessions in Yellowknife, NWT. The Tłıchǵ were represented at the sessions by Kerri Garner, Tłıchǵ Lands Protection Department and Henry Zoe.

On June 6, 2012 De Beers sent the Tłıchǵ a DVD dated May 2012 containing in high resolution PDF format: (1) EIS submitted to the MVEIRB December 2010; (2) July 2011 update (updates to Sections 8, 9, and 10 submitted to MVEIRB July 2011); and (3) 2012 EIS Supplement (updates to Project Description and relevant sections submitted to MVEIRB April 2012). This DVD replaced the DVD dated July 2011.

On July 16, 2012 Tłıchǵ submitted two (2) Information Requests (IRs) to the MVEIRB and on September 13, 2012 De Beers submitted its responses to the Tłıchǵ IRs to the MVEIRB and to Tłıchǵ.

On October 22, 2012 Tłıchǵ submitted its Technical Report to MVEIRB's public registry to which De Beers responded to MVEIRB and Tłıchǵ on November 8, 2012.

On November 1, 2012, the MVEIRB held a Pre-Hearing Conference in Yellowknife, NWT. The Tłıchǵ were represented at the session by Ginger Gibson.

3.6 Yellowknives Dene First Nation

As described above and detailed in Appendices C, D and E, YKDFN representatives participated in the following engagement opportunities:

- Traditional Knowledge Study Meeting (August 2012)
- Wildlife Working Group Meeting (July-August 2012)
- Wildlife Workshop (September 18, 2012)
- Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop (September 20, 2012)
- Site Workshop (August 10, 2012)
- Alternatives to the Adaptive Management Committee Workshop and Meetings (October – November 2012)

The following section provides additional engagement activities with YKDFN as well as specific input provided by YKDFN representatives.

3.6.1 Traditional Knowledge Study Meeting, August 2, 2012

At the request of De Beers, the YKDFN Director of Lands Management met with De Beers on August 2, 2012 to review the YKDFN's TK Study Proposal, submitted to the De Beers on July 12, 2012. YKDFN agreed to amend the Proposal to include an interim report for submission to the MVEIRB Public Registry on November 19, 2012. YKDFN also agreed to amend the Proposal to include finalized maps, TK information on mine plan and monitoring as well as details on meetings, participants, etc. in the final TK Study Report scheduled for submission in April 2013.

De Beers agreed to finalize its comments on the Proposal, review the Proposal as well as the YKDFN TK Study Agreement and return its final comments to the YKDFN Director of Lands and Management. The Proposal was signed on August 3, 2012, and on September 27, 2012 both the YKDFN and De Beers finalized the TK Study Agreement.

3.6.2 Wildlife Monitoring Plan

On June 15, 2012 De Beers invited YKDFN to participate in the WMP Working Group to which YKDFN agreed to participate on July 4, 2012. On July 9, 2012 De Beers proposed the first WMP Working Group meeting and on July 27, 2012 YKDFN confirmed its attendance. See Section 2.1.3 for additional details about the meeting.

The YKDFN consultant attended the WMP Working Group Meeting #2 on September 5, 2012. See Section 2.1.4 for additional details about the meeting.

3.6.2.1 Wildlife Workshop, September 18, 2012

On September 7, 2012, in response to De Beers' commitments at the MVEIRB Technical Sessions in May, 2012, to use a collaborative approach, including communities, to develop a WMP, De Beers invited three (3) representatives of YKDFN to a one (1) day workshop to discuss the development of the WMP for the Project scheduled for September 18, 2012. De Beers noted that a focussed working group composed of a delegate from each organization registered with the MVEIRB review process had been providing input to De Beers over the last month on approaches for wildlife monitoring and that the next step in the development of the WMP was to present an update on those approaches and obtain feedback from a broader audience. It was further noted that the workshop is an opportunity to discuss how TK is considered, where additional TK can be incorporated and used to compliment or supplement the monitoring plans.

To facilitate the logistics of planning the meeting in coordination with the Snap Lake TK and AEMP Workshop as well as the Project Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop, De Beers requested that YKDFN consider selecting the same representatives for all three (3) workshops.

Consistent with De Beers' community engagement practice, capacity funding for participation in the workshop was provided by De Beers to assist in involving technical consultants or in paying honorariums to experts.

On September 14, 2012 YKDFN confirmed their attendance at the Wildlife workshop. See Section 2.1.5 for additional details about this workshop.

3.6.3 Site Visit and Workshop, August 10, 2012

In response to comments made by the community during the February 9, 2012 public meeting and workshop in Dettah, De Beers wrote to the YKDFN on February 28, 2012 with a request to host a delegation of YKDFN to the Gahcho Kué Project site in summer 2012, comprised of Elders, Lands and Environment staff, youth, and leadership representatives. De Beers requested a response before the end of May.

On June 22, 2012 De Beers again wrote to YKDFN following up on its invitation dated February 28, 2012 noting that it was looking forward to hosting a one (1) day event to share its knowledge about the Project and provide an opportunity for participants to share their knowledge and provide guidance to De Beers. De Beers had designed a site workshop to view the Project from the air, the land, and the water to encourage participants to share valuable input on several key components including fish salvage plans, monitoring program, closure plans, and fish habitat enhancement features as described in detail in its invitation brochure. De Beers further offered to provide capacity funding for the site workshop to ensure active participation and involvement of YKDFN Elders and lands and environment committees.

On June 17, 2012 YKDFN confirmed its interest for the site workshop. On July 10, 2012 YKDFN confirmed the date of August 10, 2012.

The site workshop began with a group gathering for an opening prayer, introductions, and welcoming remarks followed by a safety orientation. A video about the Gahcho Kué Project was played to re-acquaint participants with the Project. The activities and schedule for the day were reviewed by De Beers and participants were divided into groups of three (3) members or representatives of YKDFN for workshop activities.

Boat tours were provided to allow participants to see where the dykes will be built, pits dug, camp and where the processed rock will be placed. De Beers also pointed out where borehole pipes and seismic lines explaining their use. During the boat tour, questions and comments about the fish salvage program, open pits, changes to the lake following mining, habitat for fish at closure, lake dewatering/

refilling pipelines, approval process, community engagement, closure objectives for fish and water quality, and fall community visits were raised.

One participant expressed concern that too many fish may be provided to people at one time during the fish salvage program and suggested relocating fish to other lakes. De Beers explained some of the challenges associated with fish transfer and pointed out that Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) is the authorizing agency for this activity. YKDFN questioned whether the pits would remain open at closure to which De Beers replied that the pits would be backfilled and the lake would be refilled with water. In response to a follow-up question about changes to the lake following mining, De Beers explained the expected character of the lake at closure including lake size, water quality, aquatic system, water levels as well as the monitoring program. An Elder provided useful knowledge regarding caribou and the pipeline for dewatering and refilling Kennady Lake, inquired about the decision making process noting that the decision should be in the hands of the communities, and emphasized the need for consistent community engagement. The YKDFN Lands and Environment Department staff member queried De Beers about the closure objectives for fish and water quality to which De Beers provided criteria as well as timelines for expected lake recovery and functionality noting that monitoring would ultimately determine when closure objectives had been achieved. Recommendations for De Beers' fall community visits were also provided by the Chief's Executive Assistant.

For one of the land based activities, De Beers' archaeologist set up a demonstration site which she used to explain and demonstrate the method used to find archaeological sites at the Gahcho Kué Project. She explained the legislation governing the collection of artifacts. She provide an opportunity for participants to view, hold and discuss a number of artifacts recovered in the Gahcho Kué Project area which she had obtained from the PWNHC on loan for this workshop. During the archaeology activity there were questions and comments about archaeology sampling intensity, archaeology sites along the winter road route, specific artifacts, storage of artifacts, YKDFN consultation, and YKDFN travel in the area was mentioned.

The YKDFN Lands and Environment Department staff member asked about the sampling intensity to which De Beers provided details about how the site was examined. In addition, it was asked whether sites located close to the winter road could be avoided. De Beers described mitigation measures for the road and confirmed that by marking the area with coloured stakes and reviewing these areas with the Project engineers, these sites could be avoided. An Elder provided knowledge about the potential source of one of the artifacts and noted that YKDFN people have a long history throughout the region. In response to questions regarding artifact storage and YKDFN consultation, De Beers explained that artifacts are stored at the Prince of Wales Northern Heritage Centre and that it may be possible to coordinate a visit and viewing at the Centre for people of the YKDFN community. De Beers also explained how the forthcoming YKDFN TK Study would be reviewed to verify its archaeological assessment.

Land activity also included a session on wildlife was provided including a review of the proposed wolverine and grizzly bear monitoring programs, maps showing sampling intensity and grid based

design. De Beers noted that both monitoring programs would be coordinated with Ekati, Diavik, and the GNWT. De Beers also noted the role of the Wildlife Monitoring Plan (WMP) Working Group and their work on the WMP. The YKDFN Lands and Environment Department staff expressed support for De Beers' wolverine and grizzly bear monitoring programs. An Elder provided knowledge regarding caribou on the winter road and showed areas on a map where he and other members of his community visited. Knowledge and concerns about the noise associated with mining and the impacts of noise on wildlife were shared and discussed. This information was considered and where feasible incorporated into the WEMP.

Helicopter tours were provided to get a 'bird's eye' view of Kennady Lake and surrounding lakes, discuss what the area will look like when the mine is operating (pits, dykes, water levels, etc.), discuss what the area will look like after the mine closes, and to provide an introduction to monitoring (wildlife, water and sediment quality, fish, and hydrology). During the helicopter tour questions were asked about the height of the mine rock piles and the footprint of the project development to which De Beers provided detailed information. Concern for caribou habitat was acknowledged.

The day concluded with berry picking. De Beers agreed to share its draft notes with YKDFN for any additional information or observations with the intent of jointly submitting to notes to the MVEIRB.

The site visit and workshop was attended by eight (8) YKDFN representatives including Elders, youth, YKDFN staff and an interpreter as well as six (6) representatives of De Beers.

On September 26, 2012 De Beers sent a draft Record of Meeting for the workshop to the YKDFN for review and comment. De Beers is awaiting final comments on the record of meeting from YKDFN.

3.6.4 Fish Habitat Compensation Plan Workshop, September 20, 2012

YKDFN confirmed their attendance at the Fish Habitat Compensation Workshop via email. See Section 2.2 for additional details about this workshop.

3.6.5 Environmental Impact Review Engagement

In May 2012, the MVEIRB held Technical Sessions in Yellowknife, NWT. The YKDFN were represented at the sessions by Randy Freeman, Director of Lands.

On June 6, 2012 De Beers sent the YKDFN a DVD dated May 2012 containing in high resolution PDF format: (1) EIS submitted to the MVEIRB December 2010; (2) July 2011 update (updates to Sections 8, 9, and 10 submitted to MVEIRB July 2011); and (3) 2012 EIS Supplement (updates to Project Description and relevant sections submitted to MVEIRB April 2012). This DVD replaced the DVD dated July 2011.

On July 16, 2012 YKDFN submitted three (3) Information Requests (IRs) to the MVEIRB and on September 13, 2012 De Beers submitted its responses to the YKDFN IRs to the MVEIRB and to the YKDFN.

On October 22, 2012 YKDFN submitted its Technical Report to the MVEIRB to which De Beers responded to the MVEIRB and YKDFN on November 8, 2012.

On November 1, 2012, the MVEIRB held a Pre-Hearing Conference in Yellowknife, NWT. The YKDFN were represented at the session by Todd Slack.

4 FUTURE ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

Following conclusion of the MVEIRB Public Hearing in December 2012, De Beers' will be preparing its 2013 Engagement Plan and will be discussing it with the leadership of the six Aboriginal groups to provide them with an opportunity to provide input into the 2013 engagement plans.

Currently, De Beers is anticipating that in addition to the MVEIRB Public Hearing scheduled for November 30 to December 8, 2012 and the subsequent MVEIRB Panel Decision regarding the EIR, the company's future engagement activities for the Gahcho Kué Project will include:

- Distribution of a November 2012 edition of the Gahcho Kué Now Newsletter and distribution of future publications regarding the Project in 2013;
- Community Meetings / Open Houses;
- Site visits;
- TK Studies; and
- Monitoring discussions.

De Beers' final engagement plan for 2013 will be shaped by the outcomes in the MVEIRB public hearing and by the input from engagement with Aboriginal community leadership on our plans which will be undertaken in the New Year.
