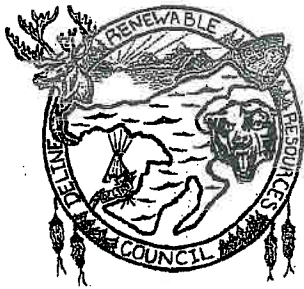

The DRRC has expressed significant concern in regards to the Sloan Drill Target in that the drill target is within a proposed conservation zone as identified in the Great Bear Lake Watershed Management Plan.

The DRRC and Deline Land Corp. along with CPAWS is in the process of establishing a wildlife protected area for Edaiila (Caribou Point) which also includes part of the Hornby Bay area of the proposed drill target for Hunter Bay Resources. This was not identified in the TEK study carried out by the Land Corp. What if anything can be done to address this concern as it will ultimately have an impact on in the processes of establishing a wildlife protected area for Edaiila.

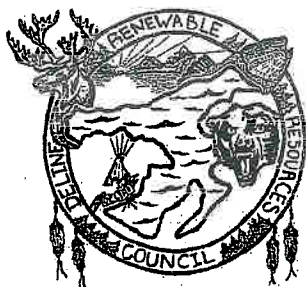
