Paramount Resources Ltd.'s Cameron Hills Drilling Project Amendments to the Final EA Work Plan and Terms of Reference

Paramount Resources Ltd. has requested that the Review Board consider making amendments to the final Work Plan and Terms of Reference for the Cameron Hills Drilling Project (see the attached Jan. 16th letter from Paramount). These amendments would be:

1) Remove references to the completing and testing of the 7 existing wells from both the Work Plan and Terms of Reference.

The amendments would consist of deleting the fourth bullet in Section 2 of the Work Plan and the second bullet in Section 2.1 of the Terms of Reference.

The Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board (MVLWB) supports Paramount's position that this work can be completed using existing land use permits and, therefore, references to this work can be removed from the current land use application and environmental assessment (see the attached Jan.17th letter for the MVLWB).

2) Paramount has requested that the 10 possible future wells be put back into the Work Plan and Terms of Reference.

References to the 10 possible future wells that were in the development descriptions in the draft Work Plan and draft Terms of Reference were removed from the final Work Plan and final Terms of Reference. The final Terms of Reference also stated that these 10 possible future wells were being excluded from the environmental assessment process due to their unknown locations.

Review Board staff will be placing these amendment requests before the Review Board for their consideration on Wednesday January 24th.



Re: Land Use Permit Application MV2000A0041 Cameron Hills Drilling Project

On August 29, 2000, Paramount submitted the subject application to the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board (MVLWB) for review. In consultation with MVLWB staff, and in an effort to streamline Paramount's regulatory applications, we concluded that efficiency could be obtained by applying for one land use permit with a wide scope. To accommodate this new process, the subject land use permit application included access to Paramount's existing wells. On November 20, 2000 the MVLWB referred the subject land use permit application to the Mackenzie Valley Environmental Impact Review Board (MVEIRB) for Environmental Assessment.

It has recently become evident to Paramount that portions of the land use permit originally applied for on August 29th were not, and/or are no longer required. Therefore, we are herein requesting that the portions of the subject land use permit application which refer to access and existing surface leases, as itemized below, be removed from the application before your boards.



- Existing access routes, campsites, and wellsites presently covered under existing Land Use Permit N 1998A0942;
- Existing wellsites covered under Crown Surface Leases A-73, C-50, N-28, B-08, J-37, C-19, A-05, I-74, M-73, C-75, B-25, L-47

To support this request we submit the following reasons:

- 1) Within the Project area, Paramount presently holds thirteen Crown Significant Discovery Licences, nineteen (19) Crown Surface Leases with existing wellbores, and three (3) Crown Production Licences joined by a network of existing access routes. In addition, Paramount has an active Land Use Permit N1998A0942 which includes access to twelve (12) Paramount wellsites in the Project area. With this existing land use permit, we do not require the access applied for in the subject land use permit application.
- 2) A land use permit covering the Crown Surface Leases for existing wellsites is no longer required. Paramount is not planning any modifications to the existing surface leases and therefore no land use permit is required at this time.

The Crown Surface Leases give Paramount the right to flow test existing wells. Paramount intends to access our existing wellsites during January to April 2001 to conduct short-term (approximately 5 to 10 day) flow-tests on wells and/or zones that have not yet been adequately tested. This testing program is required to determine the types of fluids the wells can produce, the pressure and flow-rates of the fluids and/or gas, and other characteristics of the subsurface reservoir. The information from this testing will assist in determining the economic value of these wells and what type, if any, production facilities will be required. These same procedures have been performed on many other wells in the Cameron Hills project area and, as in the past, will be regulated through applications to the National Energy Board (NEB). These applications are well specific and must include wellbore specifications, flow-testing specifications and parameters, equipment specifications and geological and reservoir justification for requiring flow-test data. The NEB determines if flow testing is justified, if the proposed operation follows existing regulations, and if a preliminary environmental screening has been completed. If these criteria are met, it is our understanding that they will then issue an authorization accordingly.

On December 19, 2000 an Environmental Assessment Draft Terms of Reference for the Paramount Resources Ltd. Cameron Hills Drilling Project was published. Contained in this document under Section 2.2 Accessory Developments and Activities, the last bullet states "may require access to any of their other existing wells". Paramount respectfully requests that this item be removed from the scope of the project.

In conclusion, Paramount is requesting that the items as specified above be removed from the land use permit application and consequently, the Environmental Assessment. In addition, reference to existing wellsites should be removed from the project description within the Terms of Reference for the Environmental Assessment of the subject application. Your earliest

attention to this request would be greatly appreciated as the operating timeline in the Cameron Hills is extremely short and the acquisition of reservoir information is critical to Paramount's future in the area.
