#### **Notes**

Paramount representatives explained the evolution of the Cameron Hills project using several map overlays. Board members questioned Paramount on the specifications of several development components, including the width of RoWs and seismic lines, the size and number of sumps, the nature of the drilling mud, and the gas processing occurring at the site. Paramount explained that the width of the RoW is between 20 and 30 m, depending on whether or not a road parallels a pipeline. Seismic lines are between 6 and 8 m wide and spaced at approximately 300m for 3D seismic. The Paramount representatives did not know how many sumps there will be in total and how big they are. Paramount uses water based gel chem mud and in the absence of salt formations and

permafrost has no need for salt solutions. Gas is separated at the well site for metering, then re-combined and send down to a processing plant in Alberta without compression. The only processing on site is the removal of water. Paramount pointed out that all the information is included in the DAR.

Participants then flew to Hay River and on to Cameron Hills in a fixed wing aircraft. While flying over the development area, Paramount representatives pointed out the location of various installations, including the battery for processing oil, pipeline RoWs, new and old seismic lines, ATV bridges with pipelines suspended from them, oil and gas well, sump locations, and the location of the winter airstrip. Because there is no summer airstrip or road access, the site could not be toured on the ground. Participants arrived back in Yellowknife at 3.15 pm. The Paramount representatives then returned to Calgary.
