## Annual Review of the Tłįcho All-Season Road Wildlife Management and **Monitoring Plan (WMMP)**

As per Measure 10-2, Part 3 of the Mackenzie Valley Review Board's Report of Environmental Assessment and Reasons for Decision (Report of EA) for the Tłicho All-Season Road (TASR) project (EA-1617-01), the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (ENR) is required to conduct an annual public review of the TASR Wildlife Management and Monitoring Plan (WMMP). ENR is working with the Wek'èezhiı Land and Water Board (WLWB) and the Wek'èezhiı Renewable Resources Board (WRRB) to coordinate the annual public review of the TASR WMMP. ENR requests that Infrastructure (INF) submit an updated version of the WMMP (v. 4.0) to ENR and the WLWB by September 15, 2020. The updated WMMP will then be posted on the WLWB's Online Review System for public comment for a period of 30 days.

ENR notes that the Conformance Table attached to version 3.4 of the WMMP contains a number of commitments to address direction from the WLWB that are still outstanding. Further direction from the WLWB on required updates to the WMMP are outlined in their April 16, 2020 decision letter approving v. 3.4 of the WMMP, as well as their July 09, 2020 Reasons for Decision regarding INF's Type B Water Licence Amendment Application – On-site sewage lagoon and groundwater well (W2016L8-0001). ENR expects version 4.0 of the WMMP to address these outstanding requirements, and to identify any further changes to the WMMP that INF would like to propose. INF should work with ENR and North Star Infrastructure (NSI), both of whom are responsible for implementing different aspects of the WMMP, to identify any such changes. As per Section 5.3 of the WMMP (v.3.4), a review of the study designs for the wildlife effects monitoring programs was completed and is attached (Attachment 1) for INF's information. This review

includes several recommendations on improvements or changes to the wildlife effects monitoring programs which should be considered by INF, ENR, and NSI, and addressed in version 4.0 of the WMMP. ENR also notes that Measures 7-1, 9-1 Part 2, 9-3, and 10-2 Part 2 of the Report of EA require updates to the WMMP when applicable information becomes available.

Version 4.0 of the WMMP should include updates to the revision history table to clearly identify which sections of the WMMP have been modified from version 3.4 of the plan, and any new sections that have been added to the plan.

Once the public comment period has concluded, INF is required by Measure 10-2, Part 3, to respond to comments posted on the WLWB's ORS, indicate how recommendations were incorporated, and provide reasons for recommendations which were not incorporated.

After responding to these comments, INF is expected to make further updates to the WMMP that reflect these responses and submit version 4.1 of the WMMP to the WRRB as a management proposal under section 12.5.1 of the Tłįchǫ Agreement by **November 06, 2020.** 

Following the WRRB's review process, and after having responded to the WRRB's recommendations, INF is expected to submit a final updated version of the WMMP (v. 4.2) to the Minister of ENR and the WLWB for approval.

A detailed description of the steps and timeline involved in the WMMP annual public review and subsequent WMMP approval process is provided in the table in Attachment 2 to this letter.

During the review and subsequent approvals of the updated WMMP, INF will continue to operate under the current WMMPs approved by the Minister of ENR and the WLWB.

August 2020	[late August] Letter issued to INF (including NSI and ENR) directing them to update the WMMP to version 4.0, including any changes that they would like to propose with supporting rationale, and submit it to ENR and the WLWB by <b>September 15</b> .
September 2020	INF submits version 4.0 of the WMMP to ENR and WLWB <b>by September 15.</b>
	<ul> <li>Version 4 of the WMMP posted to the WLWB Online Review System for a 30 day public comment period. Version 4.0 of the WMMP should include the following attachments:</li> <li>Independent review of TASR WMMP wildlife effects monitoring programs (Rettie, 2019).</li> </ul>

WRRB posts Version 4.1 of the WMMP on their website for public

December 2020	The WRRB Board meeting is planned for the <b>last week of November or first week of December</b> .
	WRRB review and decision is circulated 7 days following their Board meeting (assume December 11), including final recommendations on version 4.1 of the WMMP.
January 2021	INF (and ENR/NSI) take <b>up to 42 days</b> (as per WRRB rules of procedure) to respond to WRRB recommendations.
	INF (and ENR/NSI) make further changes to the WMMP, if required, and then submit version 4.2 to ENR and WLWB for approval (assume <b>end of January 2021</b> ).

February 2021	ENR/WLWB take up to 30 days to make a decision to approve, approve with further conditions, or reject version 4.2 of the WMMP ( <b>end of</b>
	February/early March 2021).
	Depending on the scope of changes to version 4.2 of the WMMP required as a result of the WRRB review, the WLWB may determine that another
	public review period is required before a decision on approval is made.
