Water and Fish



Potential for increased fishing activity

- Impacts anticipated to be low
- Through the Tłicho Agreement, the Tłicho Government through the law making authority of the Tłicho Assembly can pass laws to control or restrict fishing on Tłicho lands
- Any actions to manage fishing, including potentially passing T\(\frac{1}{2}\)cho Laws, will be carried out based on monitoring, community input, T\(\frac{1}{2}\)cho Assembly direction and based on the principle of maintaining a healthy and productive fishery
